UPDATE: ANIMAL PEDIGREE ACT

CRTWH Secretary, Leslie Hunchuk, and Treasurer Dianne Little represented CRTWH at the CLRC Annual General meeting on Saturday, April 5 in Calgary, AB. The afternoon was devoted to a discussion regarding the future of the Animal Pedigree Act. A representative of Agriculture Canada opened the discussion by presenting a series of thoughts regarding the Act, including reasons why it might be re-examined. This was the first of meetings designed for input into the APA.

Groups that operate under the APA but who are not part of CLRC were invited to attend and participate. These groups included the Canadian Kennel Club. With one exception, every person at the meeting was in support of retaining the Animal Pedigree Act. There was discussion of changing some parts (rather minor at this point).

When it becomes available, the discussion, as well as the presentation by the representative of Agriculture Canada, will be posted on our website, **crtwh.ca**, for your information.

Dear Regie,

When is the best time to register my foal? She is about nine months old now.

Dear Owner,

The cheapest rate for registering your foal is anytime **from birth up to a year of age**. It will cost \$40 if you are a member, \$80 for a non member. After one year, the registration fees keep going up the longer you leave it.

It *is* a good idea to wait until the foal is close to a year, because baby hair is so fine that it can be hard to get the root bulbs on the mane hairs. You'll need these to send in for the DNA analysis for parentage verification.

Another reason to wait until Baby is nearly a year is to be sure of her colour. Foals can be like chameleons for changing colour -but usually you'll be sure by one year of age!
