ASK REGIE

If you have any questions about registering a Walker in Canada with CRTWH, you can go to the website for frequently asked questions under the 'Ask Regie' heading, or check the Schedule of Fees. If you don't find the answer there, send your query to the Board and the CRTWH Registration Committee will be happy to help.

Here is a question that is often asked:

Dear Regie,

We have a Tennessee Walker that is only U.S. registered. We'd like to register him in Canada since he was born and bred here, and also we are thinking of entering him in one or more of the Canadian Challenge Programs.

What do we have to do to get him registered with the Canadian Registry of the Tennessee Walking Horse?

Reply:

We are always happy to hear from someone who likes a challenge! But your question isn't too hard to solve.

If you have the U.S. papers on your TWH and they are recorded in your name, all you have to do is photocopy both sides of them.

You then send the photocopy to Canadian Livestock Records in Ottawa, accompanied by a properly filled out CRTWH registration application for the horse. You can get this form on-line or from CLRC.

Currently the fee for membership in CRTWH is \$25 for a calendar year and \$45 to register an already U.S. registered horse and bring it into the Canadian Registry.

I hope that answers your question, but if not, just ask again! We're here to help.

Dear Regie,

I am in the process of buying a nice TWH gelding. I am new to the breed and my previous horse was grade.

The seller gave me a photocopy of the gelding's papers. I have not seen the original registration papers but was told he is registered. The seller said the photocopy proves he is registered.

Should I be satisfied with the photocopy? What would be on the other side of the papers? Thank you for your help.

Reply:

Any person who advertises a horse as purebred or registered is obligated by Canadian law to produce the horse's original registration certificate for your inspection. And the registration certificate must be in the name of the person selling the animal. Only the recorded owner can transfer the registration to you, the buyer, and he must do so within six months of the date of sale.

So no, you should NOT be satisfied with only a *copy* of the registration certificate, leave alone only one side of it. The back will show who is the legal owner of the animal. The name there should be the seller's. If it's not, he cannot transfer it into your name, and for all you know, may not even be the legal owner.

You can double check the ownership of the horse by noting its name and registration number from the photocopy and going online to CLRC.CA . You can look up the horse in the records there (provided that it is Canadian registered). You will find the breeder and the current owner of record listed there.

Since it's important to you to own a registered TWH, walk away from this one unless and until the seller finds the original certificate of registration with his name on it as the owner, and you check it out for yourself.
