There are ten stalls available plus paddocks at Hillview and local Walker owners will be making space for visitors' horses at their places too. Horse accommodation will be on a first come - first served basis, so let Larry know as soom as possible if you plan to bring a horse.

Larry says there's lots of room for campers and trailers at his place and you are most welcome to stay there.
