Ellwood has done some travelling around this year. He was up in the Peace area but didn't catch anyone at home and later, in Sask., had a good visit with Marlene Sams and saw her horses, but missed Ralph Mor-den.

Russ Davies phoned to say they have sold Ebony's Dakota Spell to Ken Douglas of Maple Creek, Sask. We were very sorry to hear that the Davies had the misfortune to lose both their foals this spring - a black colt and a sorrel filly. Such a loss is really heartbreaking.

Others, too, have had bad luck with foals this spring. The Gurnetts and the Nick Browns both lost sets of twins and Lacy's had a nice black colt born dead.

Nona Bonertz writes, "This week I went down to Polson, Montana and bought a really super stud colt from Ethna Friesen and brought him home. His name is Master's Mountain Man, grandson of Master Mac S.A.B.C. by Midnight Mack K by Midnight Sun. On his dam's side, grandsire is The Going Thing by Merry Go Midnight by Merry Go Boy. He is only a yearling and is 15 hands already, a rich chestnut sorrel with a blaze face. "

Bryan Bexson's mare, Delight's Romeo Lady, is being trained as a cutting horse by Vern Bendle of Prince Albert. She is really doing well and they are thinking of entering her in some open cutting competitions.

From Linda Osbak: "Our kids, Shawn - 12 years, and Jason - 8, took riding lessons for six weeks this spring. They were both on three year old Walkers my husband broke - a gelding and a mare - and they were such well behaved horses the rest of the people there couldn't believe it. There was an obstacle course set up - plastic, a bridge, logs, tires, etc. for the kids to ride over and out of 15 horses (other breeds), only the Walkers went over them all the first try and never blinked. Shawn and Jason were surely proud of their Walkers and received lots of compliments. I do think Walkers are by far the best horse for a child or inexperienced rider. Their quiet nature can't be beaten! By the time six weeks were up we had small children who at one time had been dumped or scared somehow of their own horses, riding our horses and loving every minute of it."

Received a letter from Barb Diplock, Aldergrove, B.C. telling of the death of their stallion, Sun's Amigo. It occurred through a tragic trailer accident and Barb would like to warn others of the hazards of using a trailer with a door in the very front. "If you are going to use this type of trailer, make SURE the door closes securely. And always cross-tie your horse." The stallion tried to leap through this front door and cut the main tendons in his front leg. He had to be put down when it became apparent that they would not heal. "Sun's Amigo may have been a stallion but he was the quietest, gentlest stallion I had ever seen. He had never done a dumb thing in his life and just this once had cost him his life. We'll all miss Sun's Amigo."

Lori Reece, Bonnyville, bought the Tennessee Walker, Matti Lou's Honey, last September. She is interested in attending shows and clinics to learn more about the breed. She got in touch through the Yellowhead Walking Horse Association's column in Horses All.

Ray Reid, R.R.1, Camrose, phoned a while back. He owns the mare, Dream's Music (Sun's Merry Man x Playboy's Dream), and recently lost his stallion, Traveller. He is now looking for a stallion to replace him. Ray, too, would like to see some clinics and shows in central Alberta.

Bill Howes, Ardrossan, Alta. made a trip to the States in June, where, with Jack Kerns, he looked at many, many Tennessee Walking Horses. From the sixty or so they viewed they selected five to take home - two black 8 year olds, Ebony's Jet Star and a mare; Ace's Perfect Shadow, a 4 year old bay gelding; and Lady's Beau Jangles, a chestnut roan 5 year old gelding. All these horses are extremely well trained. In addition he brought home a 2 year old black filly, Shadow of Riverview, who is started under saddle. All are from the U.S. except Lady's Beau Jangles, who came from Marjorie Fabro at Kimberley, B.C. Good luck with these good horses, Bill! Some will be for sale if you're looking for a TWH.
