CALGARY BENEFIT HORSE SHOW - Aug. 24 & 25 at Stampede Park

This show includes American Saddlebreds, Tennessee Walkers and Welsh Ponies. It is a recognized Canadian Equestrian Federation Show, governed by the C.E.F. rules. There are 108 classes in all, of which 23 are for TWH. & nine more are open to Walkers. ### TRAINING YOUR WALKER with DIANE MEIS SEPT

ESTION: When re-schooling a poorly-made\* Walking Horse, do you concentrate on achieving and intaining the running walk first and then do the schooling in this gait?

SWER: Yes, you must first allow the horse into the running walk so that she fully understands e gait before asking for "other movements" while doing the running walk.

This re-schooling, in most cases, starts with the flat walk. Does the horse have a nice laxed flat walk? If not, this must be attained before you can move into the running walk.

Here is a good time to point out a problem we have in training the Walker. When training should concentrate on the movement and, to a degree, the form that the horse has at that ment. We shouldn't just focus on doing the running walk. If the form and movement are good if the speed she is going then we're at the "top of the class". If they're not good, we can proper making progress because we will not achieve something good from a poor foundation.

If our horse is relaxed, nodding its head, and swinging its hind end, then, nine times out ten, we'll be able to push a bit more again and still maintain the movement but be going ust a bit faster.

Eventually, this will turn into the running walk. Some horses will do this sooner than there depending on natural ability. Then we can work on developing the running walk, just we did in getting from a slow, properly executed walk, through a good flat walk, to a slow unning walk. But remember, once the horse is no longer relaxed, you are not going to have our best movement and therefore the training will be very limited.

To qualify "... to a degree the form ..." that I mentioned several paragraphs back. When oing a loose long-strided "dog" or slow walk, the horse may not look like it is "in form". he neck may be sticking straight out in front and the head may be hanging low. It may not a pretty picture to some people. But, this is great form for what the horse is doing at hat point. If the head is nodding you're achieving what you want.

While at any speed, from a dog walk to a running walk, if you are able to maintain it or let's say 100-150 feet, then you can start asking for easy exercises, such as changing irection or a large, loose circle. The proof will be in the pudding as to whether your horse comfortable in and able to maintain the gait. It will also determine whether you are able maintain your position and help the horse execute the exercise. If your horse maintains no gait be sure to praise her and let her know that what she is doing is correct.

You may have a horse that has a nice relaxed canter. If so, you may find that for a orse poorly-made in the flat walk and running walk that the canter is your best gait from nich to work.

When you bring your horse down from the canter, push her on so that she doesn't drop nto a dog walk. Check her back gently on the reins but keep pushing with the legs. If he takes a few strides of running walk, praise her immediately and try the same exercise jain. The main idea here is to keep the impulsion coming from the hind end while having he front end reach.

Remember, the way in which the horse is executing the movement she is doing is of the importance. Don't just focus on the running walk. Once you and your horse get there, wen go to town with what you ask for from your horse in accordance with the training you and me have.

DR. PHIL WRIGHT, GUELPH, writes, "For many years I have been active in bird dog trials and was aware of the TWH brought up and often left in Manitoba, Saskatchewan and Alberta by the 'pros' such as Bybee, Madison, TenBroek, husen, Eaton & Gates, most of whom I have met casually on the dog circuit. Indeed, my ambition has been to run my own dogs in the trials in Alberta at the A-7 Ranch, Gleichen, etc. However, it's really too costly to trailer a couple of horses out there. I've ridden some of the Quarter Horses at Gleichen and they are rough for a day in the field."

"If you wish I will try to help with a 'census' of TWH in South-Western Ontario. I don't know all the owners but I can add the field-trialers who

are not 'joiners'. They are strictly 100% users."

"One thing that caught the eye of myself and a couple of friends who perused your letters last evening is the small size of so many of the TWH advertised. Sure, we have many of them too, but strive for at least 15:2 and 1100 lbs or more. My own two are 16 & 16:1 hh and 1200 + lbs. I know the old Walkers were somewhat smaller but we go for strength and sturdiness."

"Right now I am breeding to Can-Am's Choice, a son of Go Boy's Crown Royal. He is 16 hh & a truly natural, keg-shod Walker. At the present time we have two spring foals, a colt & a filly; three 2 yr olds, a gelding and two fillies; two brood mares, one 13 and one 'aged' (papers never got transferred); two aged geldings whose papers were never completed by field trialers and one 6 yr old Missouri Fox Trotter. Five of these are boarders."

"I am in the market for a strong, athletic, completely natural gelding which would be ready to go to work in field trials; 15:2 hh or better." Ed. Note: My apologies to Mr. Wright for a mistake in the last newsletter.

He has been in Walkers for 11 years, not eight as reported.

## BRITISH COLUMBIA NEWS

MICKEY CHAPMAN, PENTICTON, writes, "I am enclosing a cheque for a two year subscription. I enjoy your publication tremendously and would hate to miss an issue. You have touched on so many points in your issues with which

I have had a similar experience."

"I first started riding a Walker - or was introduced to one - when a friend, Virginia Budgen, showed me a purebred mare which had been brought from New Mexico as a two year old. She was almost 17 hands, of a colour described as 'flea-bitten' - off white with little black freckles. She was about seven when I saw her and had a colt of the same colour at her side. Frankly, I wasn't impressed by her - she wasn't a thing of beauty. Six months later I was riding her. (We had access to a pasture and in Penticton they are hard to come by.)"

"She had had a wire cut on one front foot and this made her compensate with a slight aberration in gait. Despite this handicap, her stamina and ability were unbelievable. She was like 'Pegasus' - truly the flying horse. We, in the Penticton club, were taken on many trail rides of some distances and the more sedate members on non-Walkers looked askance as we floated by

them effortlessly."

"Her owner would not sell her and two years later she died, two weeks before foaling. She had been injured jumping a creek. Her name was Bell's

Merry Legs."

"In the meantime I had found 'Stardust Parade'. He was the first foal sired by Jim Browne's Okanagan Roan Ace out of Stardust. Jim Browne and a Mr. Tipton had purchased a carload of TWH (reg'd stock) around 1948, I believe. Bell's Merry Legs was one of them, and although Jim wanted to keep her, he had to part with some of them. Some went to the Kootenays with Mr. Tipton and I believe Pearl Tompkins obtained some of her foundation stock from him."

"There were many part-Walkers in this area but my Parade was one of the few purebreds. He was sold to me by a lawyer who had obtained him from a prestigious dude ranch which was started in the Okanagan by a very good horseman who had the best of everything but went too far in his line of cre-

dit."

"Parade was improperly handled after this and gelded at age six. He became very neglected and when I was offered him I took him for six weeks to see if the damage was permanent. He was half-starved; he looked like a broomstick and was full of worms and wood ticks in his mane. But I bought him and he recovered to his beautiful, glorious self. We had him for 19 years. He never recovered from his distrust of men and he was truly my horse. I rode him everywhere under all sorts of conditions. He was such a beautiful chest-nut with a flaxen mane and tail and a bald face that he was outstanding in appearance amd demeanour."

"We had to have him put down at age 27 last year."

"I recently sold a lovely mare and have her filly. I also own the great-granddaughter of Bell's Merry Legs and Okanagan Roan Ace. She is Strolling Stella, a beautiful 16 hh chestnut, but I can't relate to her as I did to old Stardust Parade. I still laugh at Kenny McLean's nephew asking my youngest son as he looked at our horses, 'Who rides that old b-tard; he's a handful', and my son replying, 'Oh, that's Mother's horse."

I went up to Quesnel the 26 of April and bought the reg'd bay mare, Sage King's Gypsy Bay, from Cindy Botkin. The mare has grown a bit taller than I'd hoped but she's very quiet and exceptionally good natured. So I'm more than pleased with her. My second daughter just loves her and rides with me nearly every evening. (Providing I let her use Gypsyi) The change in feed caused her to break out in a rash ... but now she's good. Two weeks ago Beryle Harrison of Penticton was up with us on Hargreaves Mt. with the little red mare, Molly Bee, now renamed 'Honey'. She's fantastic in the high hills. There are getting to be quite a few reg. and grade gaited horses in our riding club and they do very well on the high mountain trails."

# TWO YEAR OLDS, ANY SEX

Halter broke - only 3 reported at prices of 1850 (twice) and \$1500. Green broke - 3 reported at prices of \$1800, \$2500 and \$2800.

# YEARLINGS, ANY SEX

5 sales reported; high price \$1800, low \$650. Average \$1040.

# WEANLINGS, - COLTS & FILLIES

10 reported; high price \$2000, low \$600. Average price - \$890.

Fewer than a half dozen people felt that they had not gotten their money's worth so there you have the prices survey. It gives only a very rough idea of prices since it represents only a fraction of the actual sales that took place during '82 & '83 & half of '84. Also in most categories there are not enough sales to form an idea of an average.

These averages do not take into account differences in conformation & quality, disposition or purity of gait, or if the animal is in its prime or well up in years. So use it only as an indicator of what some Walkers have sold for in the past. Thank you to all who were interested enough to send in your transactions. I hope you find the information helpful.
