PEDIGREES by Cristine Holt, reprinted from The Walking Way, Dubuque, Iowa

"I love learning about other people's horses, what they do with them and their breeding. But many of us as plantation people need to pull ourselves out of a rut that's been created for us by popular show horse brainwashing and that we've been content to lay in too long. I'm speaking of

the pedigrees of our fine plantation horses."

"Frankly, we've got to learn to stop expecting every good plantation horse to have a show horse pedigree. ... If we are to take on the responsibility of breeding horses, we should make sure that our knowledge goes beyond MIDNIGHT SUN and MERRY GO BOY as well as the old favorites such as Ebony MASTERPIECE and SUN'S DELIGHT. If we live outside of Tennessee, we should acquaint ourselves with our area bloodlines. We can't just dismiss them as "no good". "

This attitude is all too prevalent here in Canada as well, as those of you who read the April <u>Voice</u> can attest to. Once again I guess it boils down to knowing what it is you want to breed for in your horses, and then selecting your breeding stock accordingly. If an attribute you need is not present in the local stock, by all means go farther afield to get it. But don't be sure it is better just because it is from Tennessee - they raise all kinds down there too.

I'll close with a quotation from "A Genetic Breeding Program" by C.G.Depew, Louisiana State University: "So in horse breeding, selection & mating of superior individuals is the key to producing outstanding offspring. Therefore, good progress can be expected by selecting horses on individual merit

and disregarding extended pedigrees."

From CINDY BOTKIN, QUESNEL, "The first two foals by my young stallion. Monteray Merrimack, were born this spring. One in February, a coal-black filly with a large star, born to a Percheron/Belgian mare, and the other in april, a half Appaloosa colt. He's really beautiful, big and nicely marked. Unfortunately I don't have any Walker mares to foal by my stallion."

I saw him when he was born and it sure brought back memories of the day'Sundust' was born. I'm anxiously awaiting the next Walker News - I enjoy my copies so much that it seems

I'm reprinting the following excerpt from a letter in The Walking Way from PHIL WRIGHT, GUELPH: "Our experience covers only 8 years with TWH but we were fortunate to start with a superb big black mare and a very good grade gelding. Delight and real pleasure tell it all so far as we're concerned. Disappointment has also been in our experience. We have tried out a number of horses, registered TWH, which could not do a running walk. Friends have also encountered the same experiences and the horse is getting a bad name in some of our areas. I have talked to a couple of professional trainers who assure me that any TWH can be 'taught' to do a running walk. Is that what we want? I happen to think not! We want to be able to raise and/or buy TWH which are the real thing, natural walking horses. We have studied hundreds of advertisements for stallions and are amazed at the very, very few which stress natural characteristics. Should that not be the first attribute?"

Walking Horse News Edson, Alberta.

Dear Marjorie Lacy.

I am still enjoying your newsletter, and am taking the opportunity to send you a picture of what I am quite sure is all the Walking Horses in Nova Scotia. The black mare, Sue, is about 15 and was imported to Hova Scotia from Tennessee in 1964, unfortunately without papers, as she is quite a mare with a big 4-beat gait and quite tireless. An accident before she was imported has resulted in arthritis in a hock. She is now in foal to a grey Arab, for next February. There have been several Arab-TWH crosses on the show circuit here, out of a roan TWH mare brought in by Dr. Glenn of Bridgewater in the 50's. These horses look and perform like Anglo-Arabs, with the Thorobred temperament. The mare has produced prior to our owning her, a black \$App, a black \$Belgian, so we are hoping for a black \$Arab. needless to say.

The roan filly is 'Shades of Autumn', who I was pleased to purchase from John and Martha Windhurst of Concord, New Hampshire, in December 83, and finally brought her home in early February. She is a 'young' two-year old, and was the pin-up full-page photo in last July's VOICE magazine. As soon as (if) the snow ever goes to stay, we will start her ground-driving. Autummn has been registered in the Canadian registry; a copy of her papers is attached.

I will put a note in the NSEF newsletter, asking if there are any other TWH in N.S., but I think not, now alive. A gelded full-brother of Autumn's is in New Brunswick with Mr and Mrs Don Robertson, Box 1702, Sackville, EOA 3CO. He is a handsome bay.

My daughter and I recently attended a Versatility clinic in New Hampshire, with Rick Wies of Indiana as clinician for showmanship and training, Mary Lou Happoldt of Concord (the regional director) for equitation, Vance Boyd for driving and Jane Fanny for jumping, and Sue Gregg for sidesaddle. There was lots of sharing of experience, lots of how-to's, and good company. The people in the New England group are very hospitable! We did not take horses, of course, and it was quite a 3-day adventure, driving down 800 miles, taking the clinic and driving back, but there was no snow, thank heavens, and it was well worth it. I have a sidesaddle, so was thrilled to have a chance to see Sue's daughter, Shanna, in action aside. It is an interesting comment on the breed that the sidesaddle horse used was Delight's Collge Boy, a stallion who had never had a sidesaddle on until that afternoon.

The horse used for jumping demonstartion was Travellin' Cindy Kate, who belongs to Mary Happoldt and was the Versatility champion for 1983 in jumping. I had the pleasure of riding her in one show over fences during the summer, and Jane, who trained her over fences for Mary Lou, took her in several others. They are now thinking of taking her in allbreed hunter competition. She is a full sister to my Autumn, and I am assured Autumn is just as likely to take to the air as Katey; she has not popped over the fences yet here, but then there's lots of company and grass inside:

The following comments are from QUENTIN BYBEE, CROSS TIMBLES, MO: "Regarding the price or pricing of Walking Horses, first we have to figure our mare investment. Anything that is class and trained is at very least \$1000. Then the stud fee - \$200 is common. Makes no difference who owns the stud, you have to figure it. Then mare care for 11 months, and the colt's care for 6 more. If you keep the colt until he is two years there is feed and care, shots, castration; then figure \$200 per month for riding him. If you have ten mares, not all will foal; some colts won't be what you expect

so sale barn them. You'll have 4 or 5 maybe worth \$2000 to \$2500." "Now let's say we don't have room for ten mares. But we like and use horses so let's buy and sell a few. It's not at all unusual to drive 100 miles to a sale, or to look at a horse at private treaty. First: sale horses are there for a reason. I never buy a horse unless I see him rode outside. Be sure the papers fit the horse. Things I look for: Short back; nice head and shoulder; good overreach; carries tail straight; stands still for mounting; walks off straight. Most common faults are hard to catch or load. If you don't like him in 2 weeks, take him back to the next sale. If he don't lose more than 100 you're lucky. Other things we watch for are students going back to school around Labour Day. Parents don't want to feed and care for a horse so he is apt to be a bargain. Also distress sales - out of feed, divorce, deaths, too many horses, moving. We have found good horses that way. But every time you go you can't buy a horse or even any tack."

"I guess what I'm saying is that I haven't figured out any way to make

much money in horses. But I've had the satisfaction of owning some good ones

and I've put some people on some good ones."

"Steve and I had some dogs entered in the Kansas City Trials a couple of years ago. Some one asked, 'Wonder what the Bybees are running up here for?'. Our friend Buff Barber said, 'I don't know what they're doing here but I'll bet anybody \$10 they are riding the best horses here.'. It made my day!"

From CRISTINE HOLT, BLUE-MIST STABLES, DUBUQUE, IOWA; "Prices for the average horses here can dip very low. I think there should be a TWH in the price range of everybody ... we try to hold by that principle at our own stable. But I also think that the public shouldn't feel inclined to buy a Walking Horse ONLY if they are cheap ... or worse yet, be surprised to find that a Walking Horse can cost just as much as any other respected breed. 18ve gotten raised eyebrows before when I've quoted prices (and we are not expensive as a rule) and I just feel it would be nice if the general public looked at the Walking Horse as a cadillac or champagne - a special treat. I think if we all work at it, things will improve for us all."

JOHN GARDNER, MADISON, Miss. sent me a page from the Mississippi Market Bulletin. There must be well over a hundred ads for horses in it and about ten were for Walkers, either for sale or at stud. Others were priced at \$1000 for a 13 yr old pleasure gelding, \$1850 for a black filly, and \$650 for a yrling colt. The service fees for the stallions were from \$50 to \$150. So it seems that prices vary a great deal down south. just as they do here. (Don't forget to add another 25% to those prices to get the comparable Canadian figure.)
