* 10% Pet Food Tax: The Government has granted an unconditional exemption to this tax, retroactive to July 1st 1985, on all Horse Feeds. (Oct/Nov issue of Horse Sense)

* A Brand New Event for Alberta next year will be a DRIVING SHOW - All Breeds - All Rigs - In the Ring and Cross Country, at Coyote Canyon, Alix, (contact Judy Rutten, 747-2236). Combined Driving is now recognised as the 4th Discipline of the Canadian Equestrian Team. Probably be on July 1st w/e. C'm on you drivers!

* Alberta's Horse Industry is now rated as generating a massive 1.87 BILLION dollars, second only to Ontario at 4.26 billion, with Quebec third at 747 million. (Equine Data Systems - Canadian Horse Industry Survey)

* Spent a delightful afternoon at Jordan Valley Farms, photographed some of the horses. Dawn Sigurdson joined us and both Rosemary and Dawn tried out my English saddles - 1) a Forward seat, 2) a Close Contact. Surprised how comfortable they were, both girls agreed English riding was more attractive to them now. Happy Jo Girl was most co-operative.

* Dawn Sigurdson has started an enterprise of her own. She has already collected over 1000 PEDIGREES (copies) of Canadian owned TWH. Hello Members!

The Canadian Walking Horse Registry has had a very good year with an increase in registrations, which is proof of the Registry's growth.

- (1) This is a reminder for the re-newal of your 1986 membership. Due to the increased cost of processing the papers in Ottawa, the membership fee will be increased to \$12.00 for adults and \$8.00 for youth. This will enable the Registry to keep the business transactions at the same low cost for you to register a horse or transfer ownership.
- (2) PLEASE double check all the forms that you fill out when registering or transferring a horse. When a form is incorrect and has to be returned, the charge for handling the papers twice was billed to the Registry. There is a sur-charge for incomplete papers which Ottawa had over looked. This year all incomplete papers will have the sur-charge sent to those who have not filled out the forms correctly.
- (3) REMEMBER, the offer to register U.S. papered horses in the Canadian Registry expires December 31, 1985. So take advantage of this offer and register now for \$15.00 per horse.
- (4) The "Walking Horse News" will be the official paper for the Canadian Walking Horse Registry. For those non-subscribers send a cheque for \$4.00 to Box 2728, Edson, Alta., TOE 0P0.
- (5) If anyone has had a problem or has any suggestions for the Registry, I would appreciate hearing from them. Input is what makes any Association successful. My address is; Box 56, Site 2., R.R.8, Calgary, Alta., T2J 2T9

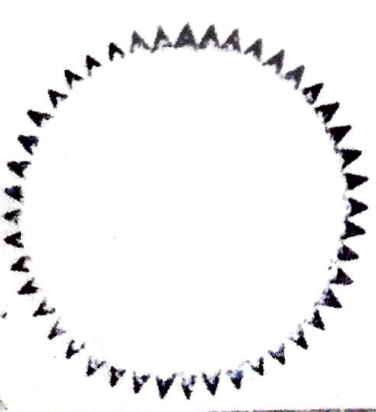

DIARY OF MY FIRST SEASON WITH A TENNESSEE WALKING HORSE.

CANDY'S BAY LADY 2: sire: SHADOW'S RED MAN dam: CAP'S CANDY STRIPER

- JULY 1983: Purchased 6yr. old mare with April filly at side. Seller's description: "Well-broke - kids can ride her. Never has carried a bit though."
- FALL 1983: Late weaning, got in a few short trail rides using a western saddle & hackamore - the way she was used to being ridden.
- MY OWN APPRAISAL: Heavy on the forehead, tendency to overbend at the poll, no response to leg aids. Flatfoot walk seemed to be extraordinary, (after riding hunters in England) - ground covering gait and a pleasure to ride. I had never before ENJOYED riding at a walk - this experience was something new. Encouraged to go faster, she seems to go into a trot, and yet it was hard to post to it and not uncomfortable to sit down and ride "glued" to the saddle. However, this was not the "GLIDE-RIDE" I had heard about. We tried a canter - she was willing enough but we had a 4-beat rhythm. Doubt started creeping in - maybe she was a poorly gaited Walking Horse; but - a horse that has been ridden for 4 years, often by untrained riders and always in a hackamore, could well have developed bad habits and just got careless. Plans were made to start training her in English tack in spring. She was, however an excellent trail horse, enjoyed being ridden, willing to tackle any country - Banks, thick bush, water, you name it, traffic and dog proof, but wary of our pigs in the field.
- FEBRUARY 1984: Started lungeing - very stiff one side to the extent of almost falling down on a circle to the right. Introduced snaffle bit and English saddle - fighting bit, throwing tongue over bit, tense back muscles.
- COMMENTS: This didn't look like a "well-broke" horse. Decided to back up 4 years and start at the very beginning. Lungeing sessions were confined to a walk until she learned to balance and give to the circle. The bit was changed to one with a copper mouthpiece, and a dropped noseband added. The saddle and girth was double checked for correct fit and placement. She was made to wear the basic bridle continuously for a while, forcing her to eat and drink over the bit.
- MARCH 1984: Dr. Whittaker's Clinic: - acted like a green horse in her English tack. Highly rated for her way of going, I was advised to work on her conditioning program - especially strengthening of hind quarters. Started serious conditioning program, through muddy fields, up and down hills, using Western and English saddles alternately. Still throwing tongue over bit sometimes, some days she had a tense back, other days relaxed. When relaxed, and after a 5 mile ride, she could do a running walk for very short periods IF on level ground and only when headed towards home! For the next two months, we did 4 to 5 mile rides, 6 days a week, always walking or trying a running walk. Now using an English saddle all the time. If she tried to TROT she was stopped.
- MAY 1984: Tried a canter - good 3 beat, and didn't hot up. Best of all she relaxed well after a short canter - was obviously feeling good and getting a lot stronger.
- JUNE 1984: Started joining in Pony Club activities: "trotting" over poles on the ground (never mind the gait), escorting kids on their cross-country practise (they jumped, we watched), and some arena work - suppling dressage exercises. Could now be guided by leg aids only, in serpentines and circles, and balance improving all the time.
- JULY 1984: Pony Club Camp: (Instructors can bring their own horses and ride in the evenings under a B.H.S. Instructor.) Finally achieved a running walk to order - for one complete circuit of the dressage ring. Introduced her to side-pass and more poles and low cavalletti. She just loved it! All work so far had been done barefoot, now I had plain trail shoes put on. Gained confidence noticeably on the trail rides, but didn't change her way of going in any way at all.

She was now (flatfoot) walking faster than any other horse in the neighbourhood. Started two weeks serious training, trailered to local arena every other day for dressage work, with cross-country rides up to 7 miles on other days.

JULY 28th 1984: Entered Gaited Horse Show for experience. Got very excited, forgot ALL her training, and only did the running walk when LEAVING the ring! - Totally embarrassing!

AUGUST-SEPTEMBER 1984: Continued trail riding and Pony Clubbing - introducing more jumping. She could now complete a 5 jump course @ 2', smoothly and clean, but would try to run out at the last part of a triple combination.

OCTOBER 1984: ATTENDED Part I of a Dressage Clinic under B.H.S. Instructor: Worked on 1) Maintaining a Running Walk, now doing several circuits. 2) Obtaining correct canter lead, left lead had always been hard to get using diagonal aids. Achieved a beautiful collected - real Rocking Chair - canter. Part II of this clinic was SNOWED OUT - end of season.

CONCLUSION: My experience with Candy has shown me that, given adequate conditioning, a relaxed and well-balanced Tennessee Walker is a truly versatile horse, with an added bonus of being a smooth ride. Candy had inherited the Running Walk; she had simply forgotten it.

Also, I'm sure you will have heard by now, but wanted to let you know that the Futurity went as scheduled and was successful beyond any of my personal expectations. Dove-tailing with the Horse Improvement Program was a definite benefit. Now we must begin to work toward the success of 1986."

At UPHILL FARM, EDSON, we are very pleased to congratulate Maureen Hummel of Enchant, Aita, on her choice of the good weanling filly, Gipsy's Dark Velvet. We wish you every success with this good moving little gal. Maureen is interested in Competitive Trail Riding and it was through this that she saw her first Walkers. She also owns the TWH gelding, Koko's Sundown Shadow, and her husband, Richard, recently bought a two yr old TWH gelding from Alf Tegart.

DAWN & DAVE SIGURDSON, ARDROSSAN recently sent out an announcement of their new stallion, under their farm name - The Walking Double D. They have purchased Merry Boy's Double 88 all the way from Ray Corum's Stables in Kentucky. This flashy sorrel coming two year old brings some exciting bloodlines to our area, being a son of Merry Boy's F-88, who is the last producing son of old Merry Boy himself. Dear Member:

At the Semi-Annual Meeting of our National Board of Directors on May 25, 1985, the following regulations were passed regarding Positive Identification and the Cancellation of Papers on Deceased Horses:

BLOOD-TYPING OF STALLIONS: All stallions born January 1, 1985, or later, shall be blood-typed at the recorded owner's expense by a laboratory recognized by the Association before any offspring can be registered. All blood-types obtained will be permanently recorded with the Association.

BLOOD-TYPING PROTEST AND CHARGES: Upon protest or charge (in writing) by any member, a Hearing Committee shall be appointed by the Enforcement Division Chairman to conduct a hearing and make a determination as to whether a foal shall be registered. The procedure shall be as any other charge or protest. The blood-type of the sire compared to that of the foal shall be submitted to the Committee prior to the hearing. The results of the comparison shall create a rebuttable presumption at the hearing which may be overcome only by clear and convincing evidence to the contrary. The Committee's decision shall be based upon all relevant factors.

DECEASED HORSES: The original Certificate of Registration shall be sent by the owner of the horse to the TWHEEA Headquarters within six (6) months of the death of the horse. This provision is mandatory and persons failing to comply shall be subject to disciplinary rules, including expulsion from membership.

The Secretary shall stamp "VOID-DECEASED" on the face of the original certificate and send a certified copy to any insurance carrier upon request.
