TRAINING YOUR WALKER WITH DIANE SEPT

Question: I am not the rider in the family, but quite often I get asked to watch to see how the horses are moving. Are there any "tell-tale" signs that I can watch for so as to be helpful?

Answer: There sure are things you can watch for. This is another place where the Walker shines. He allows us many, easy to see, signs as to whether he is moving correctly or not.

All of the things I will mention to watch for are true in both the flat walk and the

running walk. Some may be more prominent in one or the other gait, however.

Let's start in the rear, at the tail. If the horse is walking, whether it be the flat walk or running walk, his tail will swing from side to side. If the tail is bobbing up and down or just jiggling in place, the horse isn't walking with a swinging stride. One of the best ways to watch for this is to tie a knot in the end of the tail.

Next, let's watch the hind legs. They should move forward and back in a smooth, swinging action. An easier movement, for the unsure, to recognize is how the feet hit the ground. The foot should touch the ground flat. There should be not stubbing of the toe

as it comes into contact with the ground.

As we move forward, we'll watch the shoulder. The shoulder should roll smoothly forward and pull strongly back. It should be the action of a swimmer's shoulder. There should be no up and down pounding action. This may take a bit of practice to be able to

see, but you will be able to with time.

The front leg action should be much like the described shoulder movement. You want to see the leg reach way out in front. The foot should grab the ground firmly and pull (along with the shoulder) the horse's body forward. It should be almost as if the foot suction cups' onto the ground. Once again, there should be not stubbing of the toe into the ground. If there is ground being kicked forward from the toe as it touches the ground, the movement is incorrect.

The neck should move up and down in a definite, consistant nod. The nod should be seen to start where the neck meets the shoulder. If this movement is deep and correct, the mane will have a waving motion. You don't want to see the mane bounce in place.

There are two other indications of proper movement. Neither are a requirement. Some horses do them and some don't. If a horse is relaxed and walking along in a good cadence, his ears may "flop" back and forth and his teeth may click together in time with his nodding.

Another part of the body to watch is the eye. Try to notice if the horse's eye is

cslm, confused, or scared.

Try to see if the horse begins to do the above mentioned movements better or worse Let the rider know as it happens. This gives the rider a chance to know what and whem he is doing things correctly or incorrectly.

You now know how to do your job. Now it is the rider's turn to do his.
