





#### ALBERTA WALKING HORSE ASSOCIATION - Northern Division

We have had a busy spring. On May 14-15 we enjoyed an excellent clinic at Coulee Stables, Millet with Ann Kuykendall. Ann is coowner/trainer at Windy Hill Walkers, Muskogee, Oklahoma. We very much appreciated the help of TWHBEA in the sponsorship of the clinic.

Ann shared her 30 years of Walking Horse experience in a basic, patient style. We had 16 horses/riders and 14 observers; one horse was brought in and ridden there for the very first time; two riders had just purchased their first horses, while several others were working on improving the canter. The development of the running walk was a goal for all the horses as this was the main focus of the clinic.

Ann also gave instruction on fitting of tack, equitation, etc. and answered many questions. On Saturday evening we had a shared supper in Millet and watched videos that Ann had brought with her.

Sunday noon session included a demonstration of Equine Dentistry by Linc Drynan. We learned the importance of regular dental examinations to keep our horses' teeth healthy and prevent problems affecting nutrition and comfort in wearing the bit. The demo included pulling some Wolf teeth and removing some caps.

Linc also gave a demonstration of Round Pen Training, assisted by Frank Lorenzy. A horse was brought in and taken right through the steps from the beginning to being saddled and ridden. This was very impressive. (The horse continued to be comfortable being handled & ridden after the clinic.)



In this particular demonstration, a dog is being "roaded". Roading accomplishes two things:

- 1) Firstly, a young pup is placed on the end of a check cord which is fastened to the saddle. This develops a "windshield wiper" pattern in the young animal for future hunting. Dogs will work from side to side and in front of the handler so a definite hunting pattern is established.
- 2) To get a dog in shape or just plain exercise, the dog is "roaded". The mathematical ratio is approximately 4 to 1 "roading" the dog for a mile is equivalent to a 4 mile run. Often several dogs are "roaded" together as competition will make them work that much harder.

The horse was originally used for transportation. However, as the horse became more accustomed to hunting, field trialing and dog training, it was apparent that these horses pretty much took over the dog handling duties. Similar to a Quarter Horse cutting cattle, these horses will handle a dog in field trialing with very little instruction from the rider.

This particular horse (Joe's Josie) was a line bred Allen mare with the Foundation stock of Hunter's Allen F-10 six times, Roan Allen F-38 four times, as well as the fountain head - Allen F-1, in her blood. She was born and bred in Montana and shipped to Canada with a foal at the age of 7 years.

Joe's Josie was a green broke range mare with very little handling, until purchased by Murray McCargar when she was 9 years old. She was immediately put into an extensive training program and within six weeks she was working dogs, ground tying, and you could fire a gun from her back. At the time of this demonstration she had been used exclusively as a dog horse for 5 years and had proved to enhance the Tennessee Walking Horse breed as she knew her job well. She never kicked or stepped on a dog or let her rider down in a Field Trial – she was all heart and put everything she had into the competition. She was gentle enough for a novice rider and spirited enough to keep an experienced rider on edge.

Occasionally, a dog will be injured or become sick while in competition. There is usually only one way to get them back to medical attention. This mare carried many a sick or injured dog back to camp. Another reason perhaps, why the Tennessee Walking Horse has become the Field Trialer's horse.




Tegun's Mt.Fawn and her 1994 filly, Chief's Mountain Honey





"The Middletons had a wagon trek over the long weekend with quite a few riders and and tents but only three wagons. Hard to round up everyone to get away at the same time."





Phone or write for kits from Mann Equitest, Inc., 335 Laird Rd., Unit 4, GUELPH, ON N1H 6J3 or phone (519)836-2400. Cost last year was between 45 and 50 dollars Canadian. Cost of the kits from TWHBEA is 50 dollars U.S., roughly \$70 Canadian, plus you have to send the blood samples across the border.



#### C.R.T.W.H - NATIONAL REVIEW

REGISTRATION OF FOALS - EFFECTIVE JULY 1st 1994 Registration of purebred Foals will now be accepted without prior registration in the U.S., when the sire and/or dam only have U.S. papers. Double Registration is not required in Canada, it is your option to obtain both Canadian and American papers on the foal. If the parents only have U.S. papers, photocopies of both sides of their papers must be submitted with the application to register the foal. If either of the parents are already Canadian registered simply quote their Canadian number in the appropriate box on the application form. Blood Typing is not mandatory for Canadian registrations. However, blood typing may be called for at any time to confirm parentage, and random testing may be done at the request of the C.R.T.W.H.

FEES for registering foals are pro-rated according to age, so have your applications in before the foal is six months old, for the lowest rate.

A MEMBERSHIP in the Canadian association (CRTWH) reduces your fees by 50% or more in most cases. Memberships can be sent in at the same time as registration applications. Make sure your

membership is in <u>exactly</u> the same name as the "Owner" quoted on the registration application form.





From the Ontario News: DR. PHIL WRIGHT, GUELPH, writes, "For many years I have been active in bird dog trials and was aware of the TWHs brought up and often left in Manitoba, Saskatchewan and Alberta by the "pros" such as Bybee, Madison, TenBroek, Kusen, Eaton and Gates, most of whom I have met casually on the dog circuit. Indeed, my ambition has been to run my own dogs in the trials in Alberta at the A-7 Ranch, Gleichen, etc. However, it's really too costly to trailer a couple of horses out there. I've ridden some of the Quarter Horses at Gleichen and they are rough for a day in the field."

"If you wish, I will try to help with a "census" of TWH in southwestern Ontario. I don't know all the owners but I can add the field trialers who are not "joiners". They are strictly one hundred percent users."

"One thing that caught the eye of myself and a couple of friends who perused your paper last evening was the small size of so many of the TWH advertised. Sure, we have many of them too, but strive for at least 15:2 hands and 1100 pounds or more. My own two are 16 and 16:1 hh and 1200 plus pounds. I know the old Walkers were somewhat smaller but we go for strength and sturdiness."

"Right now I am breeding to Can-Am's Choice, a son of Go Boy's Crown Royal. He is 16 hh and a truly natural, keg-shod walker. At the present time we have two spring foals, a colt and a filly; three 2 year olds, a gelding and two fillies; two brood mares, one 13 and one "aged" (papers never got transferred); two aged geldings whose papers were never completed by field trialers and one 6 year old Missouri Fox Trotter. Five of these are boarders."

From the B.C. News, MICKEY CHAPMAN of PENTICTON wrote,

"I first started riding a Walker - or was introduced to one - when a friend, Virginia Budgen, showed me a purebred mare which had been brought from New Mexico as a two year old. She was almost 17 hands, of a colour described as "flea bitten" - off white with little black freckles. She was about seven when I saw her and had a colt of the same colour at her side. Frankly, I was not impressed by her - she wasn't

a thing of beauty. Six months later I was riding her. (We had access to a pasture and in Penticton they are hard to come by.)"


"She had had a wire cut on one front foot and this made her compensate with a slight abberation in gait. Despite this handicap, her stamina and ability were unbelieveable. She was like "Pegasus" - truly the flying horse. We, in the Penticton club, were taken on many trail rides of some distances and the more sedate members on non-Walkers looked askance as we floated by them effortlessly."

"Her owner would not sell her and two years later she died, just before foaling. She had been injured jumping a creek. Her name was BELL'S MERRY LEGS."

"In the meantime, I had found STARDUST PARADE. He was the first foal sired by Jim Browne's OKANAGAN ROAN ACE (Allen's Gold Ace 440068 x Fisher's Joanna 450328) out of STARDUST. Jim Browne and a Mr. Tipton had purchased a carload of TWH (registered stock) around 1948, I believe. Bell's Merry Legs was one of them and although Jim wanted to keep her, he had to part with some of them. Some went to the Kootenays with Mr. Tipton and I believe Pearl Tompkins obtained some of her foundation stock from him."

"There were many part-Walkers in this area but my Parade was one of the few purebreds. He was sold to me by a lawyer who had obtained him from a prestigious dude ranch which was started in the Okanagan by a very good horseman who had the best of everything but went too far in his line of credit."

"Parade was improperly handled after this and gelded at age six. He became very neglected and when I was offered him, I took him for six weeks to see if the damage was permanent. He was half starved; he looked like a broomstick and was



full of worms with woodticks in his mane. But I bought him and he recovered to his beautiful glorious self. We had him for 19 years. He never recovered from his distrust of men and he was truly my horse. I rode him everywhere under all sorts of conditions. He was such a beautiful chestnut with a flaxen mane and tail and a bald face that he was outstanding in appearance and demeanour."

"We had to have him put down at age 27 last year."

"I recently sold a lovely mare and have her filly. I also own the great-granddaughter of Bell's Merry Legs and Okanagan Roan Ace. She is Strolling Stella, a beautiful 16 hand chestnut, but I can't relate to her as I did to old Stardust Parade. I still laugh at Kenny McLean's nephew, as he looked at our horses, asking my youngest son, "Who rides that old b - - tard? He's a handful" and my son replying,

"Oh, that's Mother's horse."

74 transactions were recorded and classified as follows.

MATURE STALLIONS, well broke: total 4; high price \$2250, low \$2000. Av. \$2162.50, halter broke - only one recorded at \$1000.

#### MARES

Three yrs & over, well broke - 27 total. Highest prices \$3200 & \$3000; lowest prices \$500 & \$600. Average price \$1780. Three & over, green troke - 8 total. High \$1600, low \$900. Average \$1262.50. Three & over, halter broke - 2 recorded at \$1500 & \$2500.

#### GELDINGS, 3 & over

Well broke - total of 6 with high price \$2500, low 1200. Average price \$1725. Green broke - total of 3; prices \$1150, \$1000 & \$2250. Halter broke - 2 only; prices \$900 & \$950.

#### TWO YEAR OLDS, ANY SEX

Halter broke - only 3 reported at prices of \$850 (twice) and \$1500. Green broke - 3 reported at prices of \$1800, \$2500 and \$2800.

#### YEARLINGS, ANY SEX

F sales reported; high price \$1800, low \$650. Average \$1040.

#### WEANLINGS, - COLTS & FILLIES

10 reported; high price \$2000, low \$600. Average price - \$890.

Fewer than a half dozen people felt that they had not gotten their money's worth So there you have the prices survey. It gives only a very rough idea of prices since it represents only a fraction of the actual sales that took place during '82 & '83 & half of '84. Also in more categories there are not enough sales to form an idea of an average.

These averages do not take into account differences in conformation & quality, disposition or purity of gait, or if the animal is in its prime or well up in years. So use it only as an indicator of what some Walkers have sold for in the past. Thank you to all who were interested enough to send in your transactions. I hope you find the information helpful.



Average Price on 8 "Well Broke Mares, 4 Years & Over" = \$3937.50

Average Price on 7 "Well Broke Geldings, 4 Years & Over" = \$3300.00

The prices are in Canadian dollars, although some of the horses were bought or sold in the States. Only two people felt that they had not got their money's worth. The training level recorded is as the owner or seller stated it. We did not define green broke, well broke, untouched or halter broke. There is too much variation for averages to be meaningful in most categories. I think it may be helpful to buyers and sellers to see the actual prices paid for Walkers of various ages and stages of training. It is interesting, anyway, and shows quite some differences from the 1984 survey!

#### THE FIELD TRIAL HORSE


Field trialing is a sport where bird dogs hunt for upland game birds in competition, while the handlers are mounted on horseback. The pointer and setter breeds are the fast running, far ranging dogs, and as such, require a horse that will keep up with them while providing a smooth comfortable ride for the handler.

The most popular field trial mount today is the Tennessee Walker. The reasons are as follows. Firstly, the Tennessee Walker is a very even tempered animal. When you have whistles blowing, dogs pointing, guns being fired, birds flushing, and plenty of excitement, you want a horse that will keep its head. Not that the Tennessee Walkers don't get excited. At some of the championship trials where anxieties are high, the horses do show it, but generally they are extremely well mannered. The Tennessee Walker has taken to field trialing like the Quarter Horse has to cow cutting. You have only to participate in a few trials to discover that the horse is probably doing more for you than you

realized. An experienced horse soon anticipates every movement of your dog and of you, the handler.

Secondly, you want a mount that is smooth. Whether you are training your dog or are in competition at a trial, there is inevitably some long, hard riding. Having a smooth mount that has endurance is essential. All the gaited horses have been tried (as well as non-gaited) and the Tennessee Walker has continued to stay at the top. Some people have tried infusing different bloodlines, i.e. TWH/draft crosses. This gives you a big, solid horse and if it is gaited, you have a pretty good animal. Other crosses have been Saddlebred/TWH, Arab/TWH, and Peruvian Paso/TWH. However, the majority of the field trial horses today are papered Tennessee Walkers. The reason for this is that most of these horses are show horse culls. (Perhaps their color was not just right, or maybe they had slight conformation defects.)

The Tennessee Walkers began showing up in Alberta in the mid sixties. The ...cont'd>

professional dog trainers from the U.S. brought them up to their summer camps. Alberta, Saskatchewan and Manitoba host a number of dog trainers from the first part of July to September. The cost of hauling these horses back south, coupled with stringent veterinary rules at the Canada/U.S. border, has encouraged the dog trainers to sell their horses in Canada at the end of the season. Each year as our field trial membership grows more horses are purchased from these trainers. The complement of local horses has grown tremendously over the past few years. Now, practically everyone in the field trial game has at least one Tennessee Walker.

Field trialing is a great sport and probably as long as the sport itself continues, the Tennessee Walker will be the field trialer's horse.



#### STARTING THE GAITED COLT WITH ROUND-PEN TRAINING

The dreams and planning -- the excitement of foaling -- the pride in watching the foal mature -- all culminate in either frustration or delight when that foal is broke to ride. Although the gaited colt moves differently from his two-beat cousins, traditional techniques for starting him under saddle do not vary much from those of the trotting breeds.


Gentle youngsters may be mounted and ridden after a few lessons of ground driving. Other colts are sacked out, perhaps longed, then mounted. Still others are hooked to a stall door, then moved out under saddle at speed until they relax to a saddle gait and begin to respond to the bit. Sometimes these methods produce acceptable pleasure mounts; sometimes they do not.

One world famous trainer of JAZZ following her trainer stock horses has developed breaking strategies based on a

understanding of the psychology of horses. Following a very successful career as a private trainer, John Lyons has developed a series of videos and symposiums designed to teach his proven techniques for starting young horses to other horsemen, both professional and amateur. These training techniques are currently being successfully employed by one Middle Tennessee pleasure horse trainer in the development of young horses that are attentive, responsive, and willing to work for their riders.

Duran Shults, of Just-A-Wee Petersburg, starts young Tennessee Walkers and Spotted Saddle Horses, as well as some of the western breeding. A native of Lawrenceburg, he grew up riding Quarter Horses, and it was his early interest in the stock type horse that led to his acquaintance with the John Lyons methods. Duran commented, "My first impression was that this was the most exciting thing I had ever seen .... and I had been there. This was the most humane training method, a better way."

John Lyons teaches in his video, Round Pen Reasoning, that the key to develop the best riding horse is control. The round pen used by the trainer is an aid in obtaining this control, so that the lessons may be completed safely for



both the horse and rider.


The first lessons taught in the round pen are done with the horse at liberty. The handler gains control of the animal by controlling its direction of movement. The trainer is quite active, moving with the horse, encouraging it to keep cantering with a wave of the arms or a flip of a lariat. Once the horse has learned to give to the trainer by facing him, the saddling process begins. One step builds on another until the horse has learned to move in the direction requested, stand quietly for saddling and mounting, and then move out freely and calmly at the discretion of the rider.

Three youngsters worked by Duran in the autumn of 1992 illustrate the versatility of Lyons' method in meeting the needs of a trio of equine personalities.


Holiday Hot Jazz, owned by Tommy and Kathy Jones of Lewisburg, is a coming two year old Walking filly. Show horse bred on the top and bottom of her pedigree, yet she possesses a laid back outlook on life that makes her open to human suggestions. Her first lesson in the round pen proceeded from initial movement to control in only fifteen minutes! After that, each succeeding lesson brought quick, cont'd p.27>



correct results. Kathy just finished showing her three year old mare, Totally Exposed, to a SSHBEA Supreme Championship, and hopes to show Jazz in plantation classes, while she continues to exhibit Totally in the summer of 1993. Whether further training leads to the show ring or the trail, it will be based on a firm foundation in a little mare who has definitely acquired the "want-to" attitude that the John Lyons method develops.

Tumbling Dice, better known as Little Amos, is a bay and white tobiano, Spotted bred on the top, out of a Walking mare. A coming two-year old stallion, he arrived at Just- A-Wee Ranch convinced that he already knew his purpose in life, and that it did not involve much human

intervention. Work in the round pen was not as simple with Amos as with Jazz. More work in the pen was required before he understood that it was better to come to the trainer than run along the rails. At the first saddling, Duran sent Amos quickly back to the rail, anticipating the bucking and pitching that did come. The lessons continued, however, with determination and patience, until Amos would follow the trainer, stand quietly without restraint for saddling and mounting, and move out with plenty of spirit but still in the control of his rider. Amos belongs to Jimmy and Tonya Moss of Lewisburg, and Tonya hopes he will be her first two year old show stallion. He is definitely a good prospect, one that will carry her in style and safety around the show ring.

Molly is a 1990 Walking filly belonging to the author's daughter. She spent the summer getting broke to saddle by a Middle Tennessee teen-age boy. But illness and chores cut down his saddle time to thirty days. When she was back home, we saddled up for the first ride. She had no patience for mounting. Once I managed to swing up, she headed out at speed, barely bridle wise, tense as a coiled spring. Her nervousness fed my anxiety so that when I finally obtained enough control for a "whoa!" and dismount, I decided that I never wanted to ride that particular mare again! And forget any ideas of her becoming tenyear-old Kristi's saddle mare!


It was my husband who suggested investing in thirty days of round pen work for Molly. It

would actually involve a process of re-breaking, since she'd been started by conventional techniques. We were astounded at the speed with which the round pen reasoning worked with Molly. After less than two weeks work, I could try her again. The minute I touched the saddle seat and gathered the reins, I could feel the difference. She was willing and waiting on my suggestions. The difference in gait was perhaps, for us, the most remarkable. Replacing the uncertain pacerack-fox-trot she had done, was a timed, cadenced, loose, flat-foot walk, with a long striding running walk when called on. The change in her attitude had allowed her natural Walking inheritance to finally come through. We are now toying with the idea of some Lite shod classes for Molly this year, but we're also looking for an acceptable mate. We dream of Little Mollies, moving just like their mother, all started naturally with Round Pen Reasoning!
