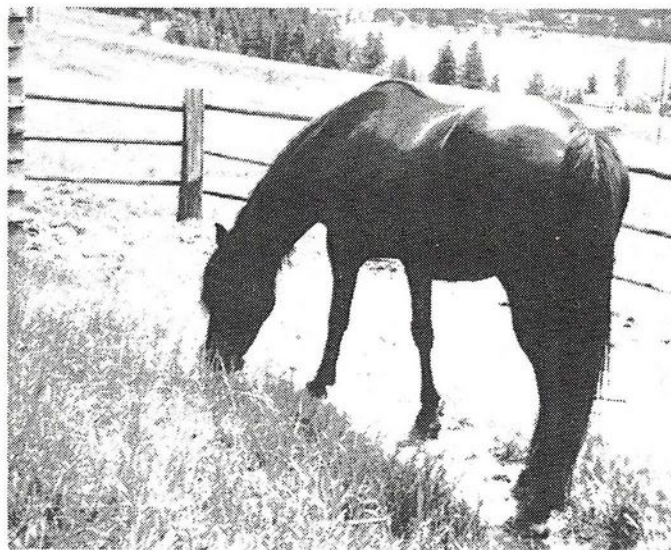

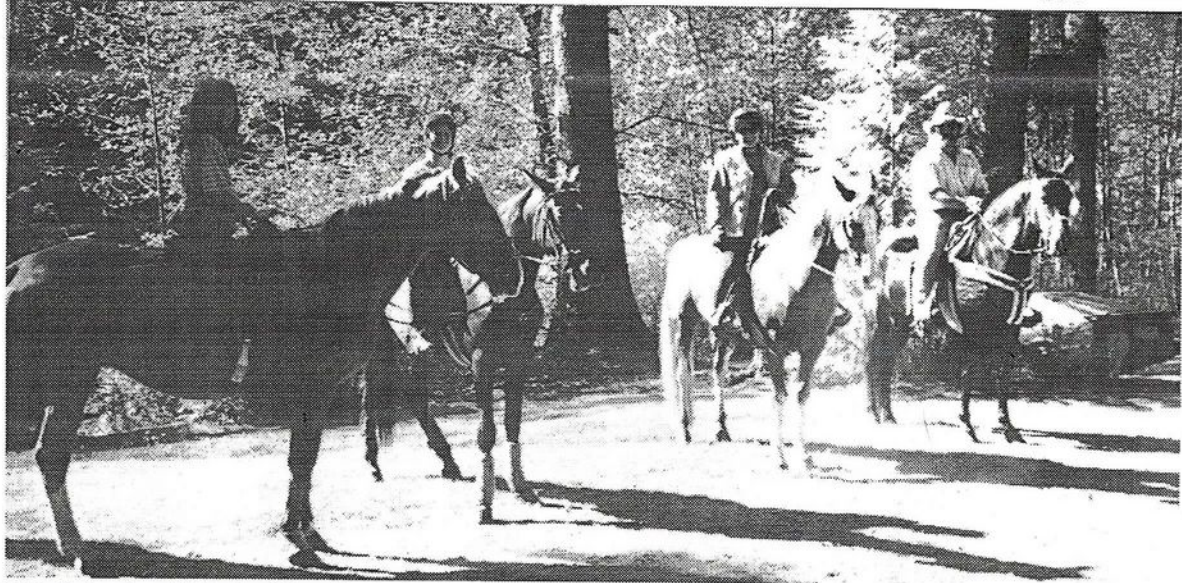
"I will be taking this year off from training. I will be back again as usual next year. I would like to thank my customers and those who have phoned. I will see you all next year."

ONTARIO NEWS

ELAINE ARMSTRONG, LINDSAY, writes, "Just a note to let you know that I was fortunate enough to purchase my first Tennessee Walking Horse last October, 1993. Rachel Poulin of Hallebourg was the former owner of this lovable, well mannered horse. The mare's name is Hi Pine Lacy and she is due to foal July 15 this year, the stud being Foxlane's Strider. I can barely express the joy I have received from owning and riding this lovable animal. If our barn contained more stalls I would love to fill them all with Tennessee Walking Horses."

RUTH VDOVICH, PICKERING, sent me the brochures and information about the Bill Reed/Marilynne Orr clinic which was held May 22 at Chestnut Hill, Uxbridge. We were far enough along on the March/April issue that we were only able to put a note in Coming Events. I hope the clinic was a great success and that you will send us a report and photos for the next Ontario news in *Walking Horse News*.

JOCELYN BRADY faxed this report to us, "Greetings from THUNDER BAY! Thought I'd let you know what I've been up to the past few weeks. At the end of March I spent several days in Aiborn, MN where I worked with Lite Shod Plantation trainer, Cindy Blom. While there I finally learned what it meant to develop a walker's back end and feel the thrill of a TWH moving effortlessly from a smart flat walk to an even more stunning run walk. I was speechless when Cindy asked me to take the horse I was riding into a running walk. I thought that was what I was already doing! Cindy assured me that this very talented Harmony mare she had trained could indeed go faster, so I collected myself and horse and proceeded to fly! To feel the back end of that mare drop underneath me and drive forward was exhilarating. Now that I had felt what a timed up TWH felt like, I knew I had to achieve that with my own."

"I came back to Thunder Bay and began working once again with my gelding, Justice. To date we have not achieved the same speed as Harmony but our timing is definitely in place and

last weekend while in Washington County, just outside St. Paul, MN, Justice and I entered our first show ring."

"Denise Ham and I were the only Canadians at the show. I'm pleased to report that we both did very well. Nobody could have prepared us for the thrill of receiving our first ribbons. The hours we had spent in the saddle training our horses had paid off! But the two day event was exhausting."

"Denise came home with a grand total of 6 ribbons, taking first place in Model Class. She was riding her husband's six year old mare, Jus' So Much Pride, purchased from Jus' Fine TWH out in Alberta. Justice, my four year old gelding, and I also couldn't complain, taking two first and four second place ribbons and a couple of trophies. Out of twelve classes we came home with eleven ribbons, never placing lower than fifth."

"What a great weekend. The Minnesota Walking Horse Association did a wonderful job orchestrating the show. The people we were competing against were very nice, helpful and good sports. I am constantly pleased at what a great bunch horse people can be."

"I hope this note findss everyone well. I know I'll be busy in another month attending a couple of clinics and preparing another gelding to enter the 25th Minnesota Celebration in July. Can a person be lucky twice? I'll keep you posted."

SASKATCHEWAN NEWS

From RHONDA GOODSMAN, ENDEAVOUR, "I didn't get all the riding in this winter that I had planned. We did get a team broke, in time for the snow to melt, but a lot of the time it was just too cold for starting colts."

"I've got a nice grade gelding to break. He's been living like a mustang but seems very sensible. I also bought a young TWH stallion, Cheer's Bonnie Boy, from Karen Memory. I'm not advertising him this year because I'm not 100 percent sure where his accommodations will be during or after the move. We're in a flood plain, you see, We were flooded twice last year, not as badly as Darlene Krauss, but it was bad enough for us to want to move. Our valley has undergone a bit of development and there is very little place for high water to go except in our front yard. KATHY STUMPH, NEWPORT, WASHINGTON, writes, "We are gearing up for foaling the three mares. The first is due 4/29/94. I'm hoping for all fillies, a black, a grey and a chestnut. But I'll be thankful for healthy foals and mares!"

NEWS FROM THE NETHERLANDS

From SUYIN OLDENBURG, The Netherlands, "My husband and I are the lucky owners of 14 Tennessee Walkers. We had two foals already and are waiting for two more to come within the next month. The most interesting point of this is that these two foals will be the first in Europe of Canadian bred Tennessee Walkers." "In the November/December issue, Debra Jack wrote about my importing two horses. The two mares, Tsuniah's DeepDeep Trouble, and Sage's Morning Mist, arrived safely after a long flight from Vancouver to Amsterdam. We picked them up at the airport after waiting a long two hours and paying an enormous number of fees. Both mares had lost some weight - that is quite normal. The guy from the shipping agency told me that some horses lose up to 80 pounds because of the stress. But both mares had been sent over in excellent condition otherwise, with legwraps and blankets to be perfectly protected.

"Now, after some five months, they are both still healthy and well and very pregnant to the beautiful sire, The Legend. If you are interested, I will write in a next letter about the birth and well being of the two foals who are advertising the Canadian bred Tennessee Walker."

"My husband and stable girl are taking a course about how to keep horses. When everybody introduced their favorite breed, my husband, Gerrit, told them about the Tennessee Walking Horse. They had never heard of the horse with no trot. In Holland, people only know the Icelandic as the only gaited breed. Gerrit promised to bring a Walker which we did. Trouble was chosen for demonstrating a true walk. After the show and talk, she carried around people who wanted to try a Walker. She was really patient with the people - to whom I tried to explain how to ride (no need for digging your heels in to the side of the horse)."

"This is all for now from this side of the ocean. I hope you enjoy the spring as I do."

Editor's note: We certainly would like to hear from Suyin about the new Tennessee Walking Horse arrivals. We hope you got just what you wanted and will write and tell us how you're all doing.

TRAC AT TEES, ALBERTA

Competitive Trail Ride sanctioned by Trail Riders of Alberta Conference

The first ride of the season was run in beautiful, mainly sunny weather after a downpour on the Friday evening that tested a couple of leaky campers! and made "vetting out" the horses a little uncomfortable. Seven TWH were among the 67 entries, two in Intermediate Heavyweight division, three in Novice Heavyweight, and two in Novice Lightweight. Five of the TWH were "veterans" of the Tees course; Maple Leaf Paint and Irish Coffee HBR were entered in their very first competitive trail ride.

Norm Levangie's gelding, Jackson's First Prize, started out in fine shape but at the first P & R vet check about 8 miles out, he had developed a respiratory problem which the vet thought was a virus and had to be withdrawn. (He was taken home and recovered as quickly as he had developed it! Bad Luck, Norman.) Lori Dyberg, new owner of Topper's June Bug (Ron Bannister's mount on this ride last year) thoroughly enjoyed the ride but their over-anxious enthusiasm ran the P & R rates up and out of the ribbons! However, I'm sure we'll be seeing this pair out again. Sheila Reum rode her young stallion Maple

Leaf Paint and competed at the Intermediate level. They had a good ride but lost points on high P & R's and a couple of minor injuries. Mary Kruger had a good ride on A Touch of Classic and was actually 2 points ahead of Irish Coffee but they were in the LWT division and this score didn't win them a place.

attention. His sire is Maple Leaf Paint and his dam is Stormy's Rain Shaker." (See Reum's ad in the classifieds.)

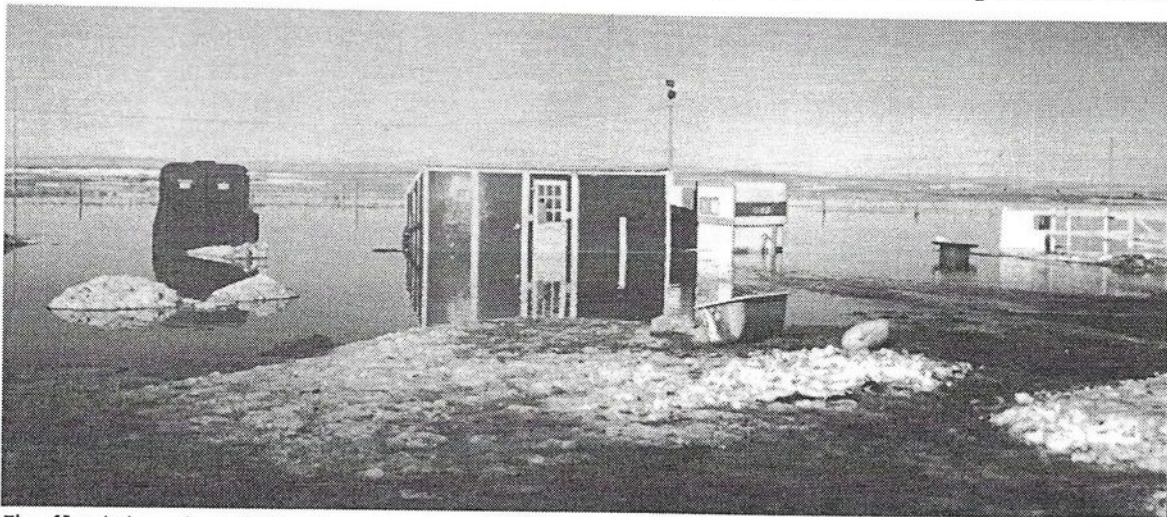
"We are looking forward to three Walker foals this year and one half Walker this summer. Those of you looking for spotted foals give us a call around the middle of August!"

"I've taken Belle to Coppocks to breed to Kit's Royal Pride. With any luck I'll get a filly and be set for a while."

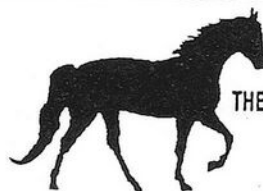
"I made a trip to Montana in March. Saw Wickman's palomino stud. He looks like he could be something for future reference."

TWHBEA NEWS

MAY 27 DIRECTORS' MEETING

The May Directors' Meeting was held on the 28 and once again I could not attend. However, I did send some recommendations regarding publicity in Canada for the Open House Weekend so Canadians can also phone toll free. I also expressed concern over the cross entering by show pleasure horses (the new class with heavy plantation shoes held on with bands) in plantation classes (although this may not be done at the same show).

COLOUR OF PARENTS ON REGISTRATION CERTIFICATES

One person has written to say she's in favour of putting the colour of sire and dam on the registration papers. DAWN SIGURDSON, LACOMBE, writes, "I would like to see the color of sire and dam on the registration certificates simply because color is apparently more predictable than we expect. It is in the gene pool and can be used by breeders to enhance their program. To me, color is like the wrapping on the present. The gift inside is most important but the wrapping makes you want to look (or ride)!"

Would anyone else like to see colour of sire and dam added to the registration certificates?

STALLION REPORTS

Don't forget you'll need stallion reports from TWHBEA to record the mares bred to your stallion this season. Under a new rule change, these reports must be filed with TWHBEA postmarked no later than October 15 each year. The rule actually states that "The report must be postmarked with U.S. postmark no later than October 15 each year" but I think that they must just have forgotten about the registrations from Canada and other countries, and don't mean we have to go to the nearest U.S. border crossing to mail our reports!

BLOOD TYPING

Foals born after September 30, 1993 must be blood typed and parentage verified before a certificate of registration will be issued. (The blood typing lab recommends that foals should be at least 60 days old before being blood typed.) For the foal to be parentage verified, both parents must also be blood typed.

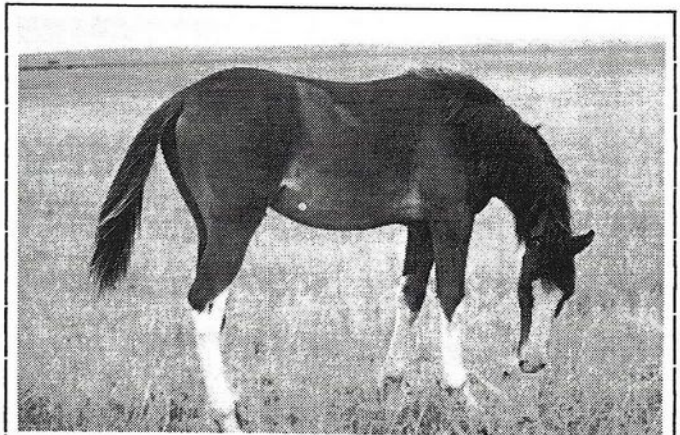

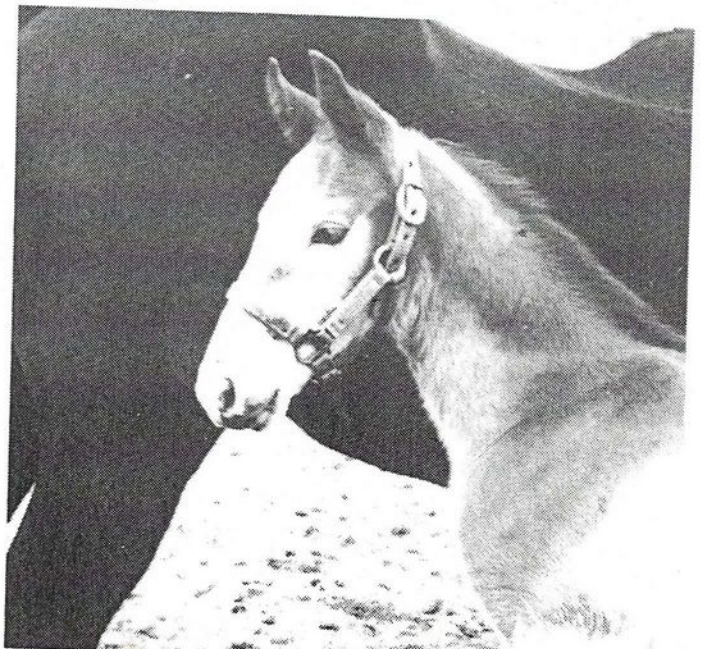

BOOK REVIEW:

The Complete Book of Foaling by Karen E.N. Hayes, D.V.M. M.S.

I found this book to be an answer to many of my questions. Karen Hayes has taken the time to put together a complete book with pictures and illustrations on foaling.

We started having foals and attending each birth in 1989. Our first foaling was a horrible experience. The foal was halfway out, head, shoulders and front legs, when all progress stopped. We called the vet and began to try to pull the foal. The mare had a rough time. Minutes before the vet arrived we got the foal out. He had died in the birth canal. The umbilical cord was wrapped around his hind legs, anchoring him in the birth canal.

Maybe this book would have helped us handle things differently. The mare came out of it okay and gave us a filly in 1990.

Karen explains what to do when something goes wrong. What is nice about it is the fact that she explains it in layman's terms and takes you through it step by step.

She also talks about preparing yourself and the mare for foaling. She gives some ways to help "guess-timate" when the mare will foal, including

a simple technique, the temperature chart. You chart the mare's temperature twice daily. I have been told that this works and plan on incorporating it into our foaling preparations this spring.

Karen takes you step by step through the normal foaling process. She then takes you through the baby's first twelve hours. In this chapter she speaks to the subjects of colostrum milk production, the aggressive mare, and how to identify the "at risk" foal. She provides check lists and how to be there and be prepared for most situations. Finally she speaks to whether or not to induce labor.

Karen has done a wonderful job with this book and I highly recommend it to anyone foaling one or 101 mares a season. It is a must for the serious horse person's library. It might just help you save your long awaited foal's life!

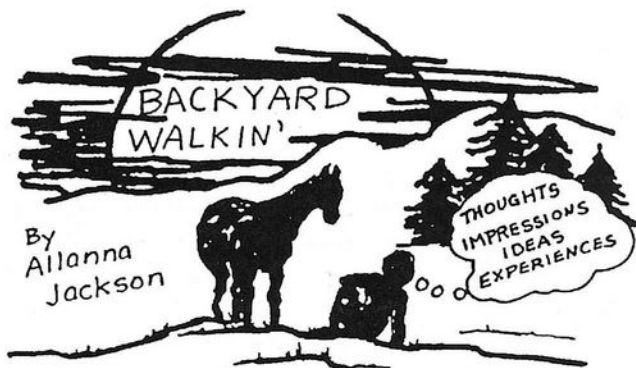

Part 2: Not so Trivial Trivia

Here are some historical facts about some of the most famous or influential horses in the Tennessee Walking Horse breed. At least one of these horses appears somewhere in the pedigree of your Walking Horse. Can you identify these individuals from the following clues?

1] This small black stallion came from a family of Narrangansett pacers imported into Canada by Mr. Louis Dansereau. Mr. Dansereau bred the mare Jeanne d'Arc and from her bred several black pacing stallions including this one.

Elias Rockwell purchased the horse in Connecticut for \$150.00, then sold half interest in the horse to John Dean.

Rockwell and Dean travelled south as peddlers, racing the black stud any place they could find takers. In New Orleans the black stallion paced a mile in the then incredibly fast time of 2 minutes 26 seconds and was immediately purchased by Major O. Duboise for \$1000. Major Duboise could find no one willing to race against his black stallion so he sold him to D. Hennisohn of Louisville, Kentucky for \$1000. Rockwell filed

a lawsuit against Dean claiming he had never received his share of the money from the sale to Major Duboise. Rockwell lost the suit. The year was 1831.

This stallion was one of the extreme rarities of the horse world - a pure gaited pacer. Not even deep snow could force him to break gait. He passed his ability to pace on to his off spring and also sired a number of easy gaited saddle horses. The stallion had one drastic fault. He was vicious. So vicious his owner could not go into the stall with him. The black pacing stallion died in 1855.

This stallion can be found in the pedigrees of 23% of the foundation stock of the Tennessee Walking Horse, including such horses as Gertrude F-84, Roan Allen F-38 and Brooks F-24. This link through Roan Allen ties all but one horse in the breed to the vicious black stallion. Who was the stallion?

2] This chestnut stallion was bred by J. N. Black of Noah, TN and foaled in the spring of 1906.

The chestnut colt was sold to J. W. Davis of Beckman's Mill, TN under the name Little Allen. Mr. Davis broke him to harness and worked him beside a pony pulling a grocery wagon. Little Allen required a yoke to keep him from jumping fences even while working in harness. This was how Mr. John G. Walker found him in 1909 when he purchased him as a coming 3 year old.

Fred Walker, John Walker's son, trained Little Allen. In 1912 Little Allen was shipped by rail to the Tennessee State Fair, riding in the same boxcar as Roan Allen F-38. Little Allen beat Roan Allen to win the stallion class.

1913 was probably the year that Fred Walker rode Little Allen from Wartrace to Murfreesboro, then hitched him double with another horse and drove to Nashville for the State Fair. He won the stallion class again, only 24 hours after the 40 mile trip.

It would have been 1916 that Fred Walker, already in Nashville for the State Fair, decided to drive back to Wartrace with a friend to visit a girl. Little Allen was hitched double with another horse and driven the round trip from Nashville to Wartrace, including the time spent visiting, in less than 24 hours.

They returned to the show in time to catch some sleep before Little Allen won the stallion class again. The 80 miles served to put him in top form for he also won the Walking Horse Stake that year.

Bright Hunter bought Little Allen in 1917. He was again entered in the State Fair where he won the stallion class. It was while owned by the Hunters that he was given the name we now know him by. Little Allen won the stallion class at the State Fair again in 1924 at age 18.

In 1926 Fred Walker asked the Hunters to let him show the 20 year old stallion again. This time the aging chestnut stud beat his own son Brown Allen at the Bedford county Fair in Shelbyville, TN.

This is the only foundation horse claimed to be pure gaited in the running walk. The Hunters said he could not be forced out of a running walk, even when working in the hills. He was considered quite fast because he could maintain an 8 mph running walk. Knowledgeable horsemen considered his conformation superior to his half brother, Roan Allen, because he had straight hind legs. His son, Tom Allen, was faulted for having too much overstride but won the Walking Horse Stake at the Tennessee State Fair 3 years consecutively, 1920-22, despite the excess overstride.

The chestnut stud had a reputation for meanness and was hard to catch in his stall. Once caught he was almost impossible to get out of the stall. He was as infamous for his bad behavior at shows as as he was famous for the quality of his

gaits. He was not related to horse number 1. The one horse in the breed not related to Roan Allen F-38 is linebred to a well known son of this horse. Which horse is he?

3] This black roan son of Roan Allen F-38 was bred by Albert Dement, master breeder of the Tennessee Walking Horse. He was foaled in 1925. This stallion was the product of two foundation horses and went on to sire one foundation horse and two World Grand Champions but was not a foundation horse himself. His offspring were known for airy movement, flashy colors and high spirits. They were successful in the showing for years but proved consistently inferior to the offspring of his 3/4 brother, Wilson's Allen. His most successful performers were outcrossed to other breeds, most notably the Giovanni family of Saddlebreds. His best producing daughter was about half Standardbred.

In 1927 Albert Dement offered Ray and Mac Tenpenny all the money they could win at the local street fair that night if they could ride the then two year old colt. The two 15 year old boys spent the day taking turns getting bucked off. Ray had another better behaved bay two year old that he believed could win. He was quite

disgusted when Mac stayed aboard the tired black roan, winning the class and all the glory with a perfect running walk. It was the first, last and only time the black roan was shown.

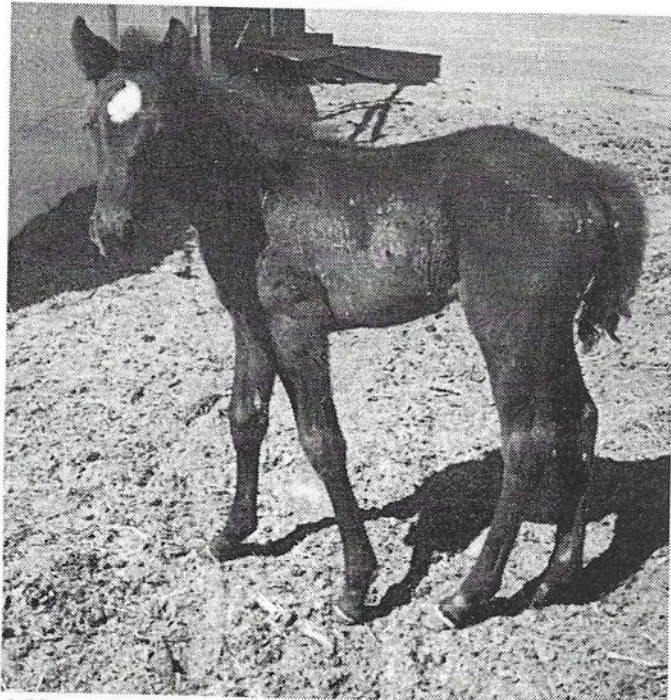
The roan stood at stud in both Culleoka and New Hermon, TN. around 1928. While in Culleoka he was led door to door but even that failed to interest breeders. His reputation as a mean horse was well established and few wanted to breed to a sound but unrideable stallion.

Mr. Carl Ingle of New Hermon succeeded in staying astride the black roan occasionally but had no real control over him. This fact was clearly demonstrated the day he bred a mare on the public road. The mare was in harness being driven to a buggy. The lady driver was much too embarrassed, and Mr. Ingle much too disgusted, to be impressed with the stud's feat of breeding the mare around harness, buggy, driver, saddle, rider and all.

The McMichaels brothers bought the black roan stud in 1935. Such defiance and intolerance were passed on to his offspring so often that even the professional trainers preferred the milder mannered Wilson's Allen family. Today the plantation industry is enamored with this stallion. Who was he?

4] This chestnut mare was another of Albert

Dement's experiments. She was foaled in 1939 and sold to Mr. Charles K. Hawkins while only a few days old. Purchase price was \$300. Mr. Hawkins tried unsuccessfully, to show her as a two year old. She was sent to Billy Grubb for professional training. She contracted pneumonia and was sent home. After recovering she was sent to Floyd Carothers. When Carothers moved she was returned to Mr. Hawkins who again tried to show her. Failing again he returned the mare to Billy Grubb.

In 1943 the mare was sent to yet another professional trainer, Steve Hill. At the time she had a pet goat which was supposed to calm her nerves. Mac Tenpenny, the same Mac who successfully showed her high spirited grandsire, barbecued the goat and beat the mare but she remained an ill-tempered hussy. Steve Hill got her performing well enough that she beat City Girl at the Fayetteville Show.

Following the Fayetteville win Floyd Carothers bought her for Frank Rambo. Carothers became too ill to train horses so the mare was sold to Dr. and Mrs. Werner of Jonesboro, Arkansas and turned over to J. B. Smith of Como, Mississippi for training.

The chestnut mare was favored to win the World Grand Championship at the Celebration in 1944 but threw a temper tantrum in the ring during the class and was taken out. Her rival, City Girl, became the 1944 winner. In 1946 the mare was again under Steve Hill's management. She won over 80 first place ribbons for the Werners. Just before the 1947 Celebration the chestnut mare was sold to Bob Cunningham of Zeleinople, Pennsylvania for \$25,000.

This mare established the best Celebration record of any mare in the breed. She is the only horse on "A Look Into the Past Video" to show three perfect Walking Horse gaits. She was remembered as having the best flat walk in the

breed but her running walk was slow. She was bred several times but failed to produce good foals even when bred to Midnight Sun. She was directly related to all the first 3 horses in this article. Who was she?

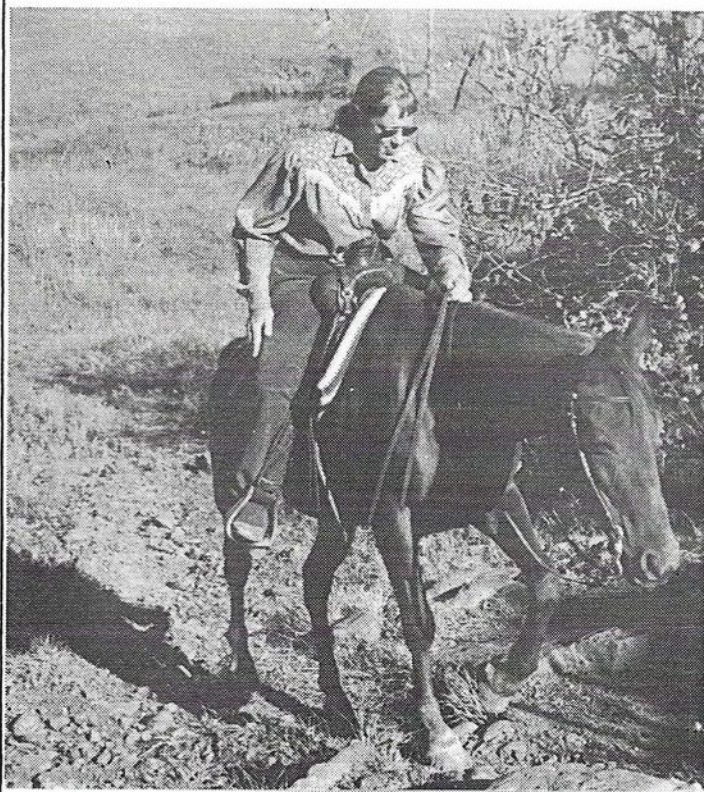
- 1] Pacing Pilot
- 2] Hunter's Allen F - 10
- 3] Merry Boy 350189
- 4] Merry Wilson 391278

What two traits do these four horses have in common? Superior gaits and bad dispositions.

Do all Walking Horses always have good disposition? It was 108 years and 11 generations from Pacing Pilot to Merry Wilson through Merry Boy. Hunter's Allen was 33 years and 3 generations back. The combination was sufficient to break Wilson's Allen's proven ability to sire mild mannered horses, even though as sire of Merry Wilson he is assumed to have greater influence. There are more examples if these aren't sufficient.

What has been done to eliminate such dispositional quirks from the breed? Pretend they don't exist while linebreeding to Merry Boy and Hunter's Allen or crossing those two families. When disposition problems are mentioned, Walking Horse people deny that bad disposition is hereditary but readily claim good disposition as hereditary. There is also denial that something that far back could make a difference now. Yet what does Merry Wilson demonstrate?

What is such a distorted view of proven facts and disregard for the laws of genetics going to do to the breed? Such thoughtless breeding will increase the number of bad tempered horses until we admit the problem exists and remove bad tempered animals from the breeding stock. This will not entirely eliminate the bad tempered Walking Horse but will eventually make it as rare as we now pretend it is. The real problem isn't the 5% or less of the population with disposition problems, but the refusal to admit that the 5% exist and are the result of genetics, not bad management or health problems.
