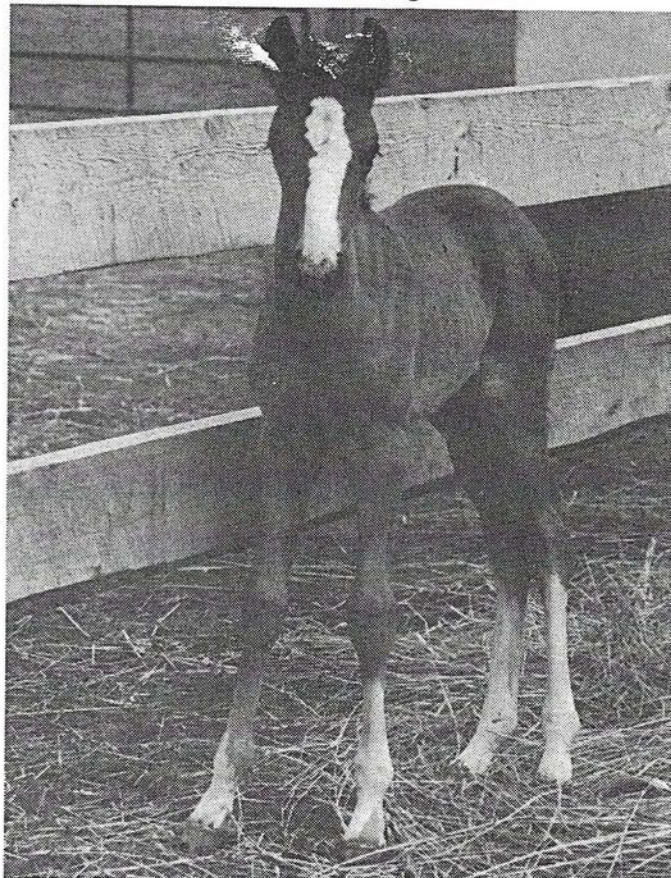
"I'd also like to take a minute to say how pleased I am to be a member of an organization like AWhA where we can still have some real fun!"

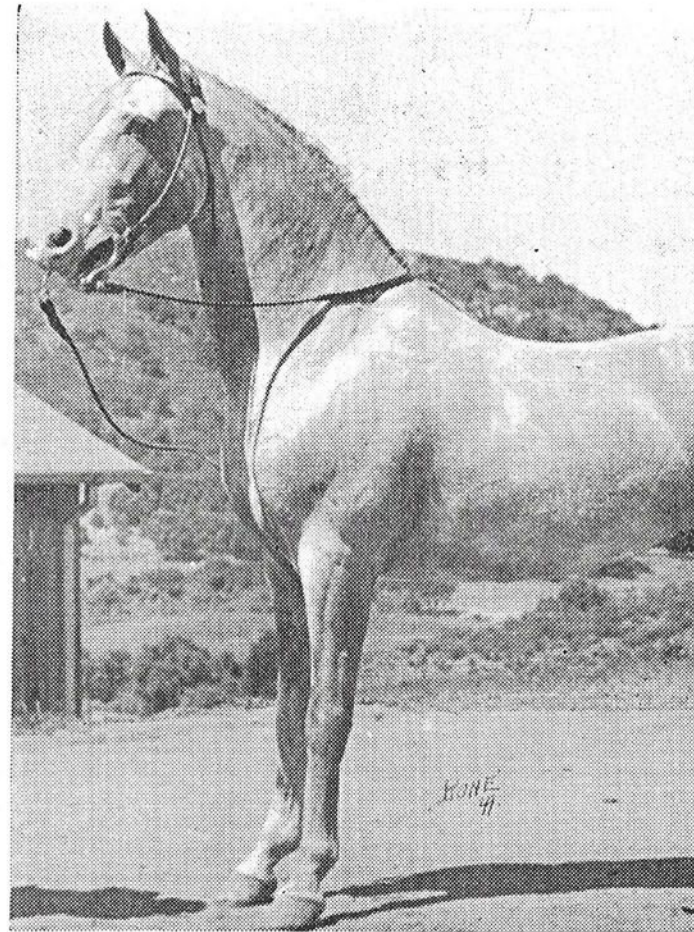

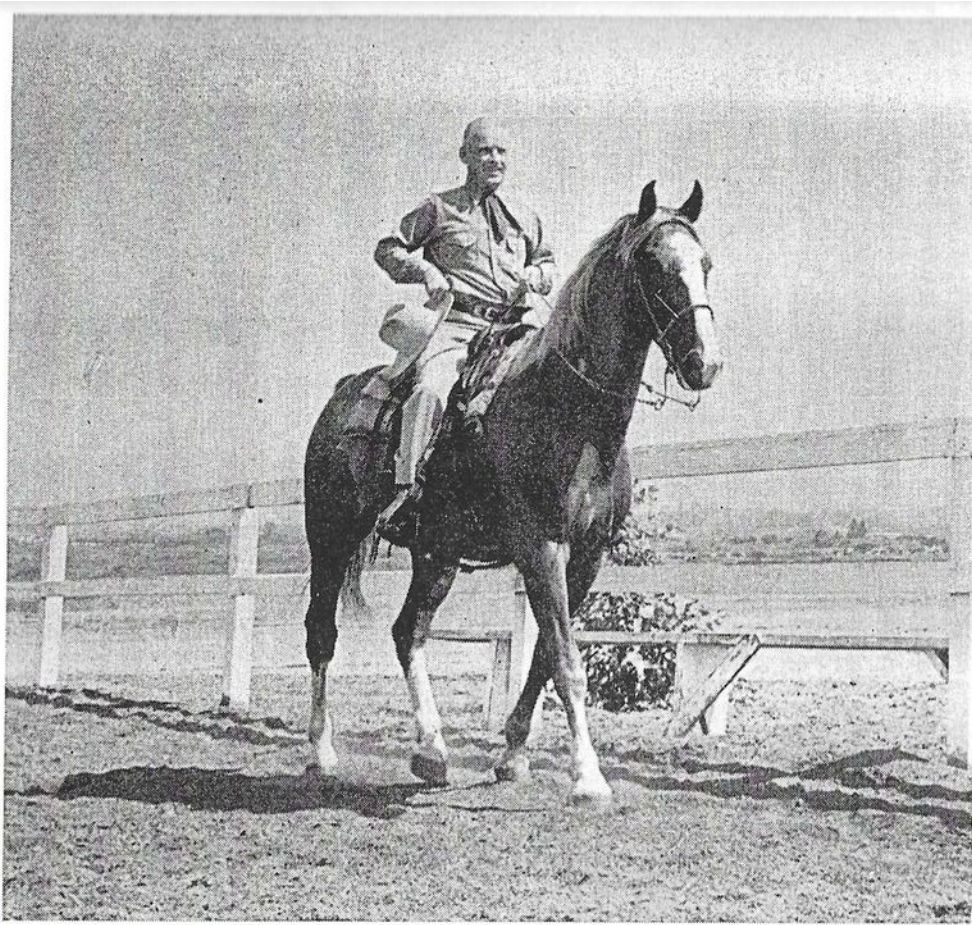

HORSE COLOURS

I've been browsing in Sponenberg's and Beaver's definitive book, *Horse Color* recently and came across these interesting items.

There are three things to consider when describing a horse's colour. First is the colour of its coat. Secondly, what colour are the "points" - its mane, tail, ear rims and lower legs. And thirdly, what white patterns or markings does the individual have.


Sponenberg and Beaver start out classifying a horse by the colour of its points; they have either black or non black points. This immediately splits horses into two main colour groups: those with black points, (black, brown, bay, grulla and buckskin) and those with non-black points, (chestnut/sorrel, red dun, yellow dun/palomino and cremello/perlino).

Thus, I could describe Sawdust's colt as a red bay with star and off hind sock and you would form a mental picture of a colt with a bright reddish brown coat and a black mane, tail, legs and ear rims, with a spot on his forehead and a white right rear ankle.

The sorrel/chestnut group are also described by colour, points and markings but here is where some unfamiliar terms creep in. We are not used to thinking of point colour with these horses as we are with the bays or buckskins.

Sponenberg and Beaver use the Spanish terms to describe the point colours in the non-black points group. Thus, "tostado" describes brown points, "alaza'n" the red or dark flaxen points and "ruano" the light flaxen points. So if you have a deep reddish brown horse with blonde mane and tail it would be termed a chestnut ruano. A reddish brown horse with slightly darker mane and tail of the same hue would be a chestnut tostado, while a bright reddish brown horse with mane and tail the same colour or just slightly lighter would be a sorrel alaza'n. This gives a more specific picture of the horse than just "chestnut" or "sorrel", doesn't it?

Now, how do we describe those sorrels and chestnuts that have everything from black to white hairs in their manes and tails!

The clinic was organized by the Bexson, Hubbard and McKinnon families of the Edmonton area. In the line classes held on Sunday the top placing stallion was Go Shadow Go, Larry Malick, Calgary; top gelding was Ebony's Chips, Denise Putinski, Saskatoon; and top mare & foal were Sunset's Tigress with Rigger's Sunset, Shelley McKinnon, Stony Plain.

In the Peace Area news, Lynda McNabb reported a superb turn-out of Walkers at the Dawson Creek show. The George Dawson Centennial class had five Walkers out of six entries in total. This was a period costume class and it was won by Bit O' Sage, owned by Don & Jo-Anne McDonald, with Lynda riding side saddle.

There was a page of classifieds with eight separate ads. Darlene Moore, Boissevain, Manitoba, was advertising a nine year old chestnut TWH mare, and Coburns of Prince George, B.C. had a weanling filly (Shadow's Super 7 x Jones Miracle Miss) for sale. In an upcoming issue I think I'll reprint what Cristine Holt had to say in 1984. There's still food for thought there, ten years later. ☺

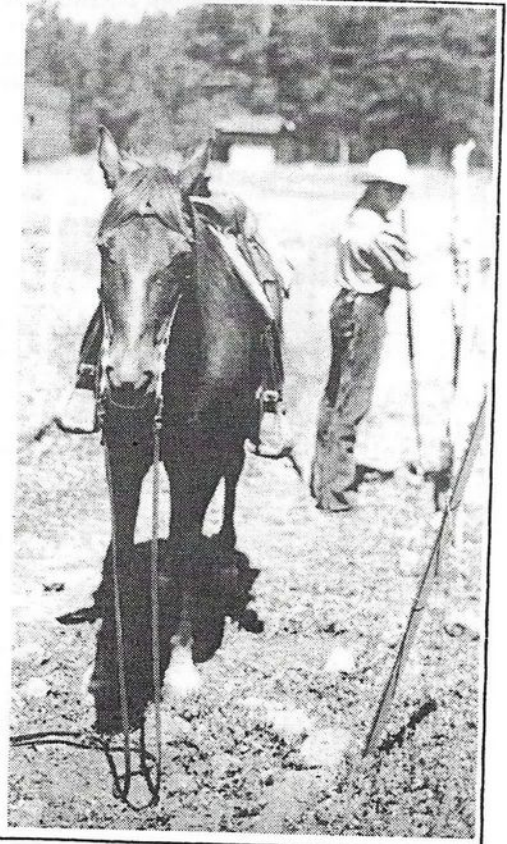

BOOK REVIEW by Cristine Holt

BACK YARD WALKIN' TRAINING TIPS by Allanna Lea Jackson

This is a new training book that is directed and tailored strictly to the flat shod Tennessee Walking Horse. Allanna is probably best known for her column, "Back Yard Walkin'" which has been seen in more than one Walking Horse publication on a regular basis. Allanna's horse, Sassy, is the foundation and inspiration for this book.

Here is a book that needs to be read slowly and more than once . . . a book destined to get dirty, either because you were reading it at the kitchen table and spilled mustard on it, or because you took it to the barn for reference and the cat walked across it with dirty paws. I found two reasons why this is a good book to read: It is a book that gives the reader a vision of how versatile his walking horse can truly be. Second, Allanna stimulates your thinking, prompting the intelligent horseman to perhaps supplement this book with advice from other established trainers. Either way, reading this book can motivate in several directions.

There is some very excellent and easy to understand instruction within the pages of this book. The first part of Allanna's book deals with the human/horse relationship. She talks about the way a horse's mind works, reminding us that it is our responsibility to be a knowledgeable and informed trainer and not expect the horse to think in human patterns. Perhaps Allanna does not deal completely with some attitudes or thinking patterns of the horse, especially problem or troubled horses, but she brings up excellent points, doing a nice job describing the limitations of a horse's thinking. However, because of limited scope, I don't believe a reader should expect instructions to deal with behavioral problems or extreme cases.

Getting on to the basic training of the horse, Allanna discusses different tack, the importance of fit, and how the tack interacts with the horse. She encourages the reader to teach the horse to respect his handler; to whoa,

IN MY OPINION: DO WE CALL THIS A CANTER?

As an owner and some-time exhibitor of Tennessee Walking Horses, I naturally attended the Alberta Celebration over the Heritage Day long weekend.

I consider myself a competent rider, having spent a number of years trained in the classic European dressage style. Nowhere, nor at any time during that training, was I ever introduced to a four-beat canter/lope. I've never seen, prior to the Celebration, this gait performed at a pace slower than the animal can flat walk. What are we doing here???

While I can appreciate the fact that it may be difficult to teach a gaited horse to canter, I would like to pass along the opinion that if the gait cannot be done properly, then don't do it.

Quarter Horse exhibitors were chastised a number of years ago when the "peanut rollers" were accepted as suitable pleasure mounts. With the exposure of the cruel methods employed to achieve this manner of going, it was literally drummed out of business.


Now, here we are, the exhibitors of

Tennessee Walking Horses, already subject to scrutiny over the "big lick", adding insult to injury.

From what I observed, the strain to the sacral joint of the horse performing this "unusual gait" (I'm sorry, but I can't consider it a canter/lope) must be monumental. As an aside, I heard a very non-horsey person make the comment, "Is that horse lame?"

I don't know about you but I consider my horse a companion, and I'd like his life to be as long and comfortable as possible. With this type of movement, surely he cannot stay sound for his entire life.

When I first acquired a horse some thirty years ago, I was taught horsemanship from the old school and was advised to do all I could for my horse's comfort. To date, it has served me well.

I'm asking that we, as owners and exhibitors of some of the most lovely horses that I've ever known, please take note of what we are doing, and keep our goals realistic. 

ground tie, side pass, back properly, and many other things which are explained in good common language. Following Allanna's guidelines encourages a person to strive to produce a pleasurable, useful mount and to also try to compete in some of the more natural and enjoyable horse show classes. This is a nice incentive book for people who want to enjoy their horses, but not to become entangled or corrupted by the sometimes misguided standards of the show ring. Here is a training book for the lover of the natural horse.

At this point, I need to point out two ideas that Allanna proposes in her book that I do not agree with. The first is concerning the matter of mental maturity in the Walker as compared to other breeds. In Chapter 4, entitled "What is a Walker?", Allanna makes this statement: Walking Horses often mature more slowly than the purely trotting breeds. . . . Mentally they are often "late bloomers." This means that your four year old Walker may be the same mental age as a 3 year old Quarter horse. At age 7 when many horses are considered to be too old to train a Walking horse may just be getting settled and really ready for training. Allanna continues "Slower mental development means that the horse may not be able to comprehend or do a particular thing now, but will, due to increasing mental maturity, have no trouble with it in six months or a year."

I take exception to this precept. Friends and I have bred and trained a few purely trotting breeds and we can't see this difference in the mental maturity that Allanna refers to. However, we have found a vast difference in the mental maturity rate between individual horses, regardless of their breed. With a little investigation among friends and a few books, I found that modern thought seems to recognize that all horses are trainable throughout their lives, no matter their age or breed.

Perhaps this "slower mental development" Allanna talks about can be summed up in one word . . . Youth! I'm glad that Allanna talks about the fact that a horseman needs to be patient with young horses and not expect the performance of a ten year old from a four year old. But my friends and I wouldn't put across her theory of mental development to cover just the Walkers. We would include all horses.

My second reservation comes in Chapter 15,

"Posture, Yours and His." Allanna's statement that a hollow topline in a horse makes it easier for a trotting horse to perform a running walk or a rack doesn't wash. Basic reading and riding of dressage theory points in a totally different direction when speaking of a relaxed or rounded topline verses a hollow topline. While the first part of this chapter that deals with rider position in the saddle is adequate, I would suggest the reader skip the second section of this chapter completely.

The joy of this book is that it's written solely for our beloved plantation horse. Allanna steers totally clear of anything that smacks of big lick folly or ineptitude. Her focus is upon developing a using-type horse and I would say that she succeeds. Allanna doesn't become sidetracked by plantation show ring standards, but concentrates upon those talents a horse needs to enjoy and be enjoyed by the horse's rider. At last, a book without "trickle-down" techniques from the artificial ranks of our industry!

The scope of this book is excellent, but it just can't cover every aspect completely. I have yet to see a book that does. My advice to any plantation horse owner is to, first, buy this book. No serious walking horse library would be complete without it. Second, I would advise the reader to supplement Allanna's book (as with any book) with other sound all-breed training principles from people such as John Lyons, Richard Shrake, and Linda Tellington-Jones. And then enjoy your horse!

IN MY OPINION: A RESPONSE TO THE WHN PRICE SURVEY

"Just a note from down in the desert. It has been unbearably hot all summer here. You pretty well have to wait until the sun goes down to do any riding.

I sent Pal back to Alberta in trade for a beautiful son of Pride's Dominator. He is a copper-tan colour with a white mane and tail. I hope to show him next summer.

There has been some interest in Knight but I am not willing to give him away. It just takes too long to make the kind of horse that I can let my kids ride and my mother-in-law can enjoy and I can still compete on.

I have attached a rather lengthy response to your request for sale prices. I hope it is of help, particularly to first time horse buyers:"

THE VALUE OF A WALKING HORSE

In recent years I have sold only three horses. I raise and train one at a time.

My seven year old gelding that had a very strong running walk, did well at all the pleasure events at the shows and was tough at the fifty miles in competitive trail rides - sold for over four thousand. My great little three year old gelding with loads of talent went for thirty-five hundred, and my big, aged, well-used gelding went for twenty-five hundred.

Doing some figuring, I sold them all too cheap. Market forces certainly come into play.

Here is what I figure for pricing a four year old horse:

The total for a well seasoned, well gaited, 4 year old would then be \$8,400. It usually takes me to age six or seven to get a horse to this point though. At this stage I feel the horse is ready to sell and the buyer will be happy.

Of course, there are always desparate people willing to sell horses for less as well as there are people willing to pay a premium for special colours, breeding or outstanding conformation. Then there is the owner who has a special attachment to a horse and so the price goes up. I don't feel that minor conformation

faults should figure into the value of a horse if all the rest is there. I've seen too many pretty horses that can't walk and lots of ugly ones that can. A fault has to be pretty severe before it interferes with the useability of a horse. Unsoundness or poor health of course, brings the value back to canner price.

The next time you are shopping for a horse, check this list against the different prospects. In most cases you could get a lot more horse for surprisingly little more money. Also, rest assured that any time you pay less than \$5,000 for a mature, even minimally trained, healthy horse you have a steal of a deal. U

COLOUR CORNER II

Here are some more interesting items I found recently in Sponenberg's and Beaver's book *Horse Color*.

All the beautiful colours we see in horses come from only two chemical pigments - eumelanin, which creates the black and dark brown shades, and phaeomelanin, the red and yellow shades.

From this, nine major genes interact to give us all the variations in colour that we see. Then, beyond that, there are nine genes that control white patterning such as tobiano, overo, sabino as well as grey, roan and rabicano, not to mention the Appaloosa patterns and dominant white. So, with at least 18 genes to influence a horse's colour, it is not surprising that predicting the colour of a foal can be so tricky. Now add to that the fact that no one has figured out inheritance patterns of white face and leg markings!

However, there are some pretty clear situations. Chestnuts and sorrels bred to chestnuts and sorrels will give you more chestnuts and sorrels. They can't be carrying black or palomino genes, despite what some ads say! What they may carry, that you can't see, is the gene for bay patterning, so you may breed to a black and get the black colour from him, the bay pattern gene from the sorrel and voila' - you have a bay foal.

Another situation that can be confusing is that of two blacks bred together that produce a sorrel. In reality it is simply that blacks can carry a hidden sorrel/chestnut gene, and pass it on. I have a red chestnut mare whose sire and dam were both jet black. Should I expect her to produce black? No, not unless she is bred to a

black. She is only carrying the genes for chestnut colour, having received one hidden gene for this colour from each of her black parents.

If you wanted all black colts you would do well to get a stallion that had two black parents who each had both parents black - but that would still be no guarantee that your stallion carried only genes for black colour. It would give you better odds that that was what he carried, but it wouldn't be a sure thing. You would have to breed to a bunch of sorrel mares and if he sired even one sorrel foal, you'd know he was carrying one gene for sorrel and one for black. What if he sired all blacks except for a few bays? That would indicate that he was passing on black only, but that the sorrels were contributing the bay patterning gene. A black horse, by definition, does not carry the bay patterning gene since in him the black pigment is spread evenly all over his body.

Another interesting situation is when you breed a bay to a sorrel and get a black. This was the case with Midnight Sun - his bay dam contributed the black colour but not the bay patterning gene, and his sire was chestnut so he contributed chestnut, and Midnight Sun turned out to be a heterozygous black that could sire both blacks and chestnuts. U



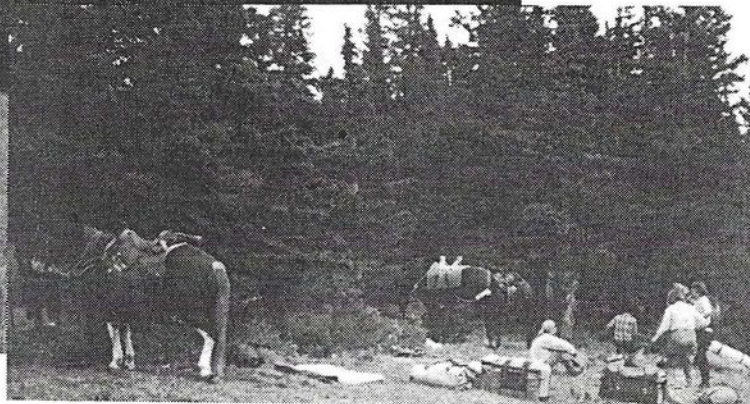
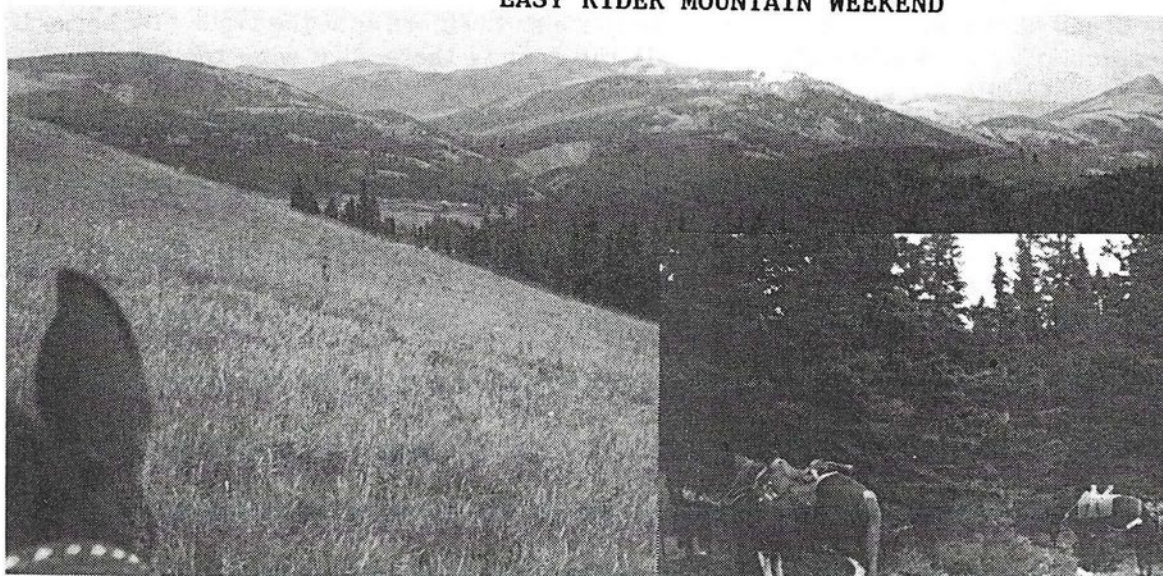
