



I then bred her to SUN'S MIDNIGHT MARK, one of the last sons of MIDNIGHT SUN still alive at the time, and got the second black daughter.

ANGEL'S EVENING STAR is now deceased. She took sick about five years ago and I had her put to sleep. She is now in a better place, but left me with two beautiful mares.

Foxy has about 8 or 9 rides on her before this so she is really green but what a wonderful smooth gait! I can hardly wait to get out on the trails with her."

ALBERTA NEWS

From ELDON EADIE, TURNER VALLEY, "Donald and Rolanda Eadie have leased two of my mares (The Last Rainbow and Touch the Sky) to breed to Gold King. If you ever get a chance, stop in to visit them. Gold King is one of the most beautiful palomino stallions that I have ever seen. Donald and Rolanda are getting off to an excellent start with some first class stock.

JO KINGSLAND, ALIX, would like to wish Rolanda Eadie of Rimbey, Alberta every success with her new mare, Panda Capri. Jo writes, "Panda was trained as a yearling by Roland Messerli and shown at the 2000 Canadian Futurity to win the Yearling in Hand class. She is now proving to be a very quick learner and this change of ownership seems to have been "made in heaven"! When I visited her new home a month after the move, I was impressed by the rapport and relationship already developed between horse and handler. The next few weeks will be very busy for this pair as they prepare for the Two Gait class at the Futurity, and I'm really looking forward to seeing my young buckskin mare return to Olds under saddle. Good luck, Rolanda!"

DONNA CURTIS, WINFIELD, WRITES, "We used Topaz Merry Go on all our purebred mares and had the most colorful foal crop we have ever had. We got every color of champagne possible - I think. They sure are looking good as they move around the pasture. The grade Percheron and part TWH mares were bred to Cee Dee's Canadian Topaz and Cherokee's High Stepper, so we got more color there.

"My old Arabian mare, Vanessa's Lady [at the good old age of 26 years] had a filly, Cee Dee Lady's Halo. I rode, packed and drove Lady for many years before we started raising Walkers and she is very special to me so I think her filly, Halo, will be a "keeper"."

Next year we are hoping to get three foals. We have bred mares to Coin's DP, DP's Shiney Tunes and Goldwell. I guess we're back into the breeding program."

I look forward to getting my magazine every month and appreciate being kept up on the news. This filly has it all: looks, presence, and the movement we all want to see."

"Dave and I are doing a great deal of riding now that summer is finally here. The heavy snowfalls in May delayed us from getting started as early as we would have liked but we're enjoying the good weather now that we have it. I've started our two 3 year old geldings with no difficulties at all. The temperament of the TWH continues to amaze me."

ALBERTA NEWS continued

CINDY DEORKSEN, HYTHE, writes, "We now have four registered Walkers, a 22 year old chestnut stud, Mack's Trail Rider (Mack's Shadow x Handshaker Candy S.); two palomino mares, a five year old, Sage's Peach Girl, and a two year old, Jeanie's Peach Girl. We also have a yearling gelding, Cody. No babies this year but next year we should have two. These horses came from the late Jeanie Keillor and are of very old lines. I am very proud to own them and am looking forward to putting a lot of miles on them."

NEIL ADAMS, , writes, "Just a short note to let you know what's happening here at ROCKY MOUNTAIN HOUSE. We now have 16 Walkers, plus a leased mare. Our stud, Angel's Ebony Secret, recovered one hundred percent from his "run in" with a stick last spring and we used him for our breeding season this year. We have purchased a new stud so are not sure if we will sell "Buddy' or geld him to keep as a saddle horse."

"Our new future stud is a yearling we purchased from Berta Knight. His name is Count's Summer Flash. His sire is Pride's Final Count, a Supreme Versatility Champion by Pride of Midnight H.F. This young fellow has eight World Grand Champions on his pedigree. We are grateful to the Knight's for giving us the opportunity to purchase this fine young prospect."

We have just returned from a trip to Alaska. We had a very good trip. Only saw one saddle horse being ridden. It was in Dawson City – and wouldn't you know it - from two blocks away you could tell it was a Tennessee Walker. The horse was being ridden by RCMP Officer Curtis Kuzma, in dress uniform to provide photo opportunities for tourists. Officer Kuzma had very little experience with Walkers and and had lots of questions. He was very impressed with the black gelding;s temperament and smooth ride. "Hi from FRAN KERIK at CRYSTAL STAR RANCH in TWO HILLS. I don't know about you folks but the weather we have been having is for the birds! (And not even them.) First we had the coldest spring (March, April, May) on record with only a little bit of snow, and now we are in the midst of an intense heat wave. The hay fields are burning up and there is no pasture. We fed cows until the end of June and then had to turn them out as there was no more feed. The horses seem to be faring better as they are all easy keepers except for the stallion who is much too interested in running around after his girlfriends. It is because of the lack of feed that I must sell some of my horses so please check out my classified ad."

"I attended the Greg Czech clinic in April. I think I enjoyed the social part and just being surrounded by fellow horse people for almost three days as much as learning horsemanship skills. Cash and I came home and practiced and now he's sidepassing pretty good. I'm now teaching my stallion some of the stuff we learned. Mornin's Glory gave me a lovely black colt with a little star and his father's walk. I gave Top O' the Mornin' the year off and she took a young lady on a 14 mile trail ride safely (and Mornin' has only a handful of rides under her belt). She has such good babies — but I wanted to enjoy her. I'd also like to thank Keith Oberle for letting me buy one of his Maremma pups. She is a wonderful dog who joyfully does her job with the goats."

"I finally got my 'pics & peds' together and they are going out with this letter. Is it ever tough to get a good photo! I am taking three year old Mornin's Cupa CoCo to a Brian Griffith round pen clinic in July. I am really looking forward to it as when I try it my horses look at me like they think I'm nuts! I must say I'm a firm believer in imprinting. After I read Dr. Miller's book I started imprinting all my foals. Cash was imprinted and last week I had his first pair of shoes put on. If anyone has ever met this horse you will know he is very suspicious of anything new. Well, he stood there like he's had shoes put on all the time!"

We went and moved a herd of 60 cows and calves today. I rode Mornin' who has only moved cattle once in her life. The calves were crazy (probably from being in a corral for five months) and ran the herd off in several wrong directions. Well, Mornin' was wonderful. She handled it like a pro and would give any QH a run for its money. I just wish I had a video of that drive to give to everyone who asks, "But what are they good for?"!"

U.S. NEWS

From ALLANNA JACKSON, LAKESIDE, ARIZONA, "Hello to everyone. It's been a wild 10 days here in the White Mountains of Arizona due to the Rodeo wildfire. I began evacuating horses June 20 and had to leave my home June 22. We were not allowed back in Thank the Lord all our property is until June 29. undamaged! The horses and I are safely home. 6-weekold Cinnamon came home with diarrhea and is a bit off her feed this morning so I'll probably have to find a Vet for her. This Koko filly has a wonderful temperament; she's handled all this evacuation stress fantastically well and been cooperative and easy to handle throughout! The rest of the horses seem to be okay. Velvet handled it all better than I thought she would. My cat is still in Globe at my Grandmother's. My parents and sister are on their way home from a ministry trip to California. My brother has been on duty at Pinetop Fire Dept. for 10 days straight so he's headed out of town for a well-deserved vacation."

"The July issue of *The Walking Horse Journal* is at the printing plant in Pinetop, which was also evacuated. It had been printed but not assembled when the evacuation orders came down. The evacuation also forced the temporary relocation of several post offices, including

the one we mail from. We'll get the magazine in the mail as soon as it is possible to do so but it will be late."

"Many thanks to all of you for your thoughts and prayers. It has been truly wonderful the way so many people have opened their hearts and homes. The outpouring of support and resources from private individuals as well as the public agencies has been exceedingly generous. Words aren't sufficient to thank everyone. It will take a few days to get things back to normal. God bless you all."

DEBBIE SMITH, MAPLE RIDGE, e-mailed, "Got a chance to attend the "Interior Gaited Horse Show". Made it home with a suitcase full of grungy clothes, boots full of arena sand, and can't wait to do it again."

I believe entries were up, but Brenda Bettles will be the one to give you the official count and/or results and show coverage. Trigger was entered in two 2-gait classes and took ribbons in both. 



The German Invasion Continues

Part 1

Last year I wrote about my experiences with a group of Germans who wished to ride Walking Horses in the Canadian Rockies. (Trail 2000, WHN May/June) Well, word got around, and this year I could have spent my whole summer as tour guide and outfitter! Since I have a life, and do not do this professionally, I tried to put some limits on it. Those limits became stretched so that two groups, one at the end of July and the second at the end of August, were "entertained".

The first group was comprised of Ina and Herbert, a couple from the former East Germany; Walter, a Swiss now living in France; an Austrian chap, Hans; a German lady, Angela; and my German contact and friend, Gerd. Readers will perhaps remember that last year I was accompanied and assisted by my daughter Elise and her husband Brad, as well as my friend Mel Lachance. Mel and I had gone in to the campsite early and set up a fairly elaborate camp. This year, none of them were able to accompany me. Another friend (since buying a Walker from me), Steve Sutherland, insisted on helping me set up camp this year. He and I set up a much simpler camp and went exploring trails in the area instead of spending the time on building tables and such.

This group, with the exception of Ina and Herbert, spoke English, and all were reasonable horse people. Ina, Herbert, Walter, and Angela all own TWH. Hans does not, but has ridden and trained horses in Germany. Gerd, president of the European Tennessee Walking Horse Association, at last count owns 10 Walkers and is a very good horseman.

This group of people was very compatible and enjoyed excellent weather the whole trip. We camped and rode the same area in between the Panther and Red Deer River systems as last year. The only "event" that will give any special memories was the Dogrib ride. What a ride! Once the summit ridge is attained, the trail follows it for miles and provides many opportunities to look down into the valleys around - back into the beautiful Panther valley and along it into Banff Park; down the Dogrib along towards the Red Deer drainage; and the fantastic Red Deer River valley itself. From that height, the Ya Ha Tin Da Ranch (owned and operated originally by the Brewster family, now the wintering and training ranch for the National Park warden horses) is only a bunch of specks in the distance. Words can neither describe the view nor the feeling of being on top of the world. The descent was also memorable, with all riders except me becoming walkers sooner or later as the incline became steeper. (We took a shortcut).

Oh yes - there was one other memorable event. I spent one night with heart arrhythmias and palpitations. By morning my blood pressure was so low I could hardly stand up. Gerd and Walter and I rode out to the trail head and they drove me to Sundre hospital, where tests

indicated a possibility of a heart attack, so I was shipped off by ambulance, tubes projecting out of many parts of my body, to Calgary. Gerd and Walter rode back in to rejoin the group. More specific tests in Calgary could find no indication of a heart attack, but since I had been filled with Heparin, a "blood thinner" with a half-life of 6 hours, I could not return to camp for a day. Mel said that there was no way I was going back alone, so he came along. I needed another horse to ride, as Gerd would have taken mine back with him. It turned out that he also took my saddle, so I rode back to camp bareback. The group had spent one day on a ride guided by Gerd who is quite familiar with that country, and one day in camp. They had just arrived out at the trailhead when Mel and I were saddled up, so we rode back in together. We were due back home the next day, so broke camp and completed the trip without incident.

INTERLUDE

During the two weeks between the two trips, Gerd stayed with us at the Skyline. Gerd had done some outfitting in some parts of the National Parks years ago, and wanted to show me some of the places he had been. Also, since the second group was going to have some repeaters from last year, we did not want to go back up the Panther valley. We took two saddle horses, no pack horses, a sleeping bag, coffee pot and dried food tied to the saddles and set out across Banff Park, heading for B.C. We left the trailer at the parking lot that was created for the Calgary Olympics Biathlon course and headed west about noon. The Banff east boundary is only a couple of kilometers from the parking lot. The trail through the park is shared with hikers and bikers, so is quite well maintained, wide and smooth. Gerd was riding Go Boy's Rena, a 10 yr old mare that I bought last year from Don & Jo-Anne McDonald. Rena had not been ridden much in her life as a brood mare, and none in recent years until this spring. She had lost her foal, so I reintroduced her to the life of a working horse. I was riding Toddys Southern Comfort (Missy), a mare that daughter Elise had sold to Barry Snowden some years ago. She is a gorgeous mare that had not been used much either, and was sent to me for some upgrading. What a ride we had! The trails are marked for distance, so we were able to keep track of our rate of travel. We averaged 7 km/hr all across Banff! Rena is a natural walker who loves to get out and go. Missy is not quite so natural, but by the second day was gaiting quite well and was an enjoyable mount, too. The power and natural athletic ability of these two big mares would make them superior horses in any breed. The gait is a nice bonus!

Once we reached the west side of Banff, the trail began to ascend quite quickly towards the summit of the

mountain range, and our rate of progress slowed considerably. By the time we reached the summit, it was around 7:00 in the evening, and there was an interesting sign awaiting us. It said something to the effect that horses entering Mt. Assiniboine Park require travel permits. This had not been a requirement when Gerd had last been there, so we were taken by surprise by this. Now what do we do? To go back into Banff Park required a permit to camp, to go on required a permit. It was too late to go all the way back to the trail head, and, besides, we hadn't seen what we came for, so we decided to take a chance on the B.C. side. When we approached the region that was indicated on our map as a horse camp area, we saw nothing - no fireplaces, no tables, no toilets - the usual stuff in park areas. A little further down the hill was a small tent city, about a dozen tents, so we wandered down for a look. It turns out that we were in the right place, all right. No open fires are permitted in that park. The campers were a group of people from Calgary and Edmonton, members of the Alpine Club of Canada. They had a camp flown in by helicopter, including a cook tent, gas stove and cook! Many of the campers had also come in by helicopter. Some of them were climbing Mt. Assiniboine, others were just out for some hiking and camping. (Mt. Assiniboine is called Canada's Matterhorn).


Again the question, what to do now? No fires permitted, permit to camp with horses required, a warden cabin about a half-hour away.... Mel frequently tells me that God hates a coward, so we decided to take our chances. We pulled back to the designated horse camp, unsaddled, hobbled the horses and turned them loose for the night. We then found a secluded spot for a little fire. We were not worried about the smoke giving us away—the sky was obscured by smoke from the myriad forest fires that were burning last summer all over B.C. and Alaska.

After a good night sleeping under the stars, we had a very nice unexpected breakfast. The "Alpiners" invited us to join them! Oatmeal, coffee, juice, toast, bacon, scrambled eggs—what more could we ask for! Much better than commercial breakfast bars that seem like a combination of sawdust and dog doo (but we ate them for lunch anyway).

This park has a large Lodge operated by Brewsters, I think. They cater to climbers and fishers who usually fly in by helicopter. Some hike in, some pack in. Brewster will pack in your gear if you wish to hike without backpacks. This lodge is on the bank of a beautiful lake whose name escapes me now. Something like Magogg. The lake was far more spectacular than the name would indicate! We were told by the "Alpiners" that we should not go back without seeing the lake. Go back? Who said anything about going back? We had already decided to carry on and do the circle route, even though the warden cabin was right on the trail. Unless the warden spoke German, (Gerd would respond to her questions and I know enough words to fake it), she was going to have trouble telling us what we were doing

wrong. As it turned out, we never did see her. The trail around the lodge and cabin area was boardwalked and roped off. I don't think horses were supposed to be there. Oh well. Too late to turn back now. Fortunately for us it was a dry summer, and the horses had no trouble bypassing the boardwalks. We probably would not have made it in a wet year. It was a big bog until we started to climb again. At the summit, a beautiful deep blue "pothole" lake became evident in the bottom of the valley. It was a spectacular view. As we moved down, the lake grew in length! It wasn't a pothole in fact, but quite a long lake. The trail swung back and carried along the lakeside, about 30 metres above the shore. What a spectacular trail, with the lake below and the mountains on both sides of us. A second lake, same color as the first, was also in view in the distance. The trail forks to go to the second lake as well, but we bypassed the detour. One of the lakes is called "Wonder" and the other "Marvel". The names don't do them justice. Perhaps the fact that we were trespassing made it a little sweeter (we now believe that the portion of the trail from the lodge on is for hikers only)!

We completed the journey, loaded up and were back at the ranch in time for supper the next night. Across Banff twice in a little over 24 hours, and memories for a lifetime.




Heading for camp at JI Hill / Dogrib Creek, July, 2001. Photo bv Angela Stumpf.

LAMINITIS OR FOUNDER

Dianne has asked the following questions "What is laminitis? Is it the same as founder? What are the signs of laminitis? What is seedy toe? Should we be concerned about laminitis?"

What is Laminitis?




Figure 1b: The insentive part of the foot or "epidermis". The outside of the hoof wall has been out away to show the primary laminae attached to the insideof the hoof wall, these primary laminae interdigitate with those on the outside of the coffin bone.

Laminitis is a painful disease that affects horses feet. It can affect one or all feet but is usually seen in the front feet concurrently. Within the horse's foot, the coffin bone is attached to the hoof wall by interwoven laminae (Figure 1a,1b). These laminae are the glue that bonds the bone to the hoof.

Laminitis vs. Founder

The terms laminitis and founder are often used interchangeably. Each of them describes a specific stage of a very complicated disease process. The term "laminitis" refers to the inflammation of the sensitive lamina. Inflammation of the laminae may stretch and break the hoof/bone bond. Mild cases that are detected early and treated aggressively can heal remarkably. However, more severe cases can result in separation of the coffin bone from the hoof wall despite aggressive and appropriate treatment. The term "founder" is used when so many laminar bonds are disrupted that the coffin bone loses its normal position and rotates or sinks within the foot. Once the coffin bone separates from the hoof wall the foot is never the same.

What causes laminitis?

Although laminitis occurs in the feet the underlying cause is often a disturbance elsewhere in the body. There are many different diseases that can result in laminitis. Some of the more common causes include:

- -grain overload
- -excessive amounts of grass
- -abrupt changes in diet
- -high fever or illness
- -toxin release
- -severe colic
- -retained placenta in the mare after foaling
- -excessive concussion to the feet or weight bearing on one limb

Horses that are overweight or on a high nutritional plane have an increased risk of laminitis. Horses who have previously experienced laminitis are much more susceptible to recurrence.

Signs of laminitis

Horses with acute laminitis are lame and often reluctant to move. They may move gingerly or stand with their front feet stretched out ahead of them ("sawhorse stance"). They may have increased heat within the foot.

Horses that have foundered show changes consistent with a disruption of the laminae. They often have rings in the hoof wall and can have dished hooves. The foot may be flat and have a widened white line ("seedy toe"). Horses with founder are more susceptible to foot abscesses and bruised soles.

What can you do?

Laminitis is a medical emergency. If you think your horse has laminitis call your vet immediately. The sooner treatment begins for a horse with laminitis the better. Diagnosing and treating the underlying cause is the first step. Sometimes the problem is pretty clear (i.e. the lid is off the grain bin) but occasionally it is very difficult to determine the original cause of the laminitis.

There are many different methods of treating foundered horses. There is no "best way" to treat and manage a horse with laminitis. It can be very frustrating for both the owner and the veterinarian because what works for one horse may not work for another. X-rays of the horses' foot can be helpful when deciding what direction treatment will take. In many cases only time will tell whether a treatment is effective. Good communication and cooperation between your veterinarian and farrier are essential when treating a foundered horse.

Managing a horse that has foundered requires a considerable investment of time and finances. Initial treatment, medication, multiple X rays, and therapeutic shoeing with frequent farrier visits are costly. The unpredictable response of a foundered horse to treatment can be an emotional roller-coaster for the owner. The horse's progress is measured day-by-day and unexpected complications can arise well into the course of treatment. Horses that develop laminitis can recover and lead relatively normal lives. However, some suffer such severe structural damage to their feet that euthanasia is the only humane option. Even horses that regain soundness can have long-term foot problems including abnormal hoof growth, recurring abscesses, and hoof-wall separation.

The best way to deal with laminitis is not to let it occur.

It's impossible to prevent all cases but some of the risk factors are manageable. Overfeeding is a very common cause of laminitis and easily preventable. Keep grain securely stored out of the reach of horses. Introduce your horse to lush pasture gradually. Don't kill your horses with kindness and let them get overweight. Recognize that a horse that is ill, under stress, or with previous episodes of laminitis is at increased risk of developing the disease. Make sure the placenta is expelled intact after foaling. Avoid working your horse on excessively hard ground.

Caring for a foundered horse can be very difficult, often heart-breaking. Research may someday help us to prevent laminitis and founder from occurring but now all we can do is deal with the consequences of this potentially devastating disease.



Stallions! The word evokes images of beauty, strength, and barely leashed power. Fanciers of a breed will often drive for miles to see a particular stallion perform the skill in which he specializes, then drive again after the horse's retirement to visit him in the plush barn in which he lives. The walking horse did not develop in such an equine setting, however. While the breed was developed for utility, stallions were generally not valued as utility horses. Mares and geldings were considered more valuable than stallions, and the top males of the breed survived as such by proving their abilities to sire foals with good dispositions, strength, intelligence, and smooth, ground-covering walking gaits.

The Faulkner Brothers of the Mulberry community of Lincoln County were fortunate to live near many such stallions. Young Jab Faulkner saw a number of these horses that have become known to history as the leading foundation sires of the Tennessee Walking Horse breed. In discussion, Leon and Jab recalled that in Jab's youth, from Flat Creek in Bedford County to the New Herman community where Haynes' Peacock won his first show, and south to Boonville in Lincoln County, breeders carefully developed lines of horses known for their good dispositions and easy, nodding gaits.

Near Jab's farm, the black breeder Jake Reese and his gray mares descended from Bramlett F-9 carried forward that foundation bloodline. After MIDNIGHT SUN was retired to stud, Jake bred these mares to him, and for many years stood a son of 'the Sun' named MY MIDNIGHT TRAVELER. His brood stock also blended the bloodlines of Womack's Merry Boy and White Merry Boy, Jr. Reese's

gray mares are the color source for many of today's most prominent strains of gray Tennessee Walkers.

The Womack Brothers stood a trio of noted horses representing three different foundation lines. BROWN ALLEN (actually a black horse) served the needs of those wanting the blend of Hunter's Allen and the Hal line, before he was sold to Clyde E. Westbrook of Cleveland, Mississippi, in whose name he was registered. RED WARRIOR, a flax sorrel son of chestnut Wilson's Allen, also contributed Brown Allen through his dam. Red Warrior proved himself as the sire of flatshod show horses, one of which, The Warrior, demonstrates his sire's stamp in the TWHBEA video A Look into the Past. Chestnut WOMACK'S MERRY MAN offered the Merry Boy line outcrossed with Wilson's Allen through his dam, Wilson's Rose Marie.

Also actively involved in breeding top horses was the Byrom family. Their well-known Merry Boy stallion bore the family name. BYROM'S ALLEN, a blue sabino with four stockings and a blaze, carried two crosses to Bramlett on the distaff side. Byrom's Allen was an established sire in his own right, but the line was also extended through his grandson sired by Wilson's Allen, Harlinsdale's Gold Bond.

Over the years of Jab's memory from childhood to retirement, the Faulkners retained some of their own stallions. In addition to the Hunter's Allen son BRIGHT, there was WILSON'S ALLEN'S GOLD MEDAL. Jab's Uncle Cal bred a mare to Wilson's Allen, standing at the time near his Mulberry farm, to get this small bay horse that sired many sorrel offspring. C.H. Faulkner also stood

LINCOLN ALLEN by Brown Allen, a stocking-legged bay whose dam was also by Wilson's Allen, tracing on the dam's side to Bramlett and Earnheart's Brooks.

Jab had explained that not as many stallions were offered at public service then as in the present. Sometimes, owners of other stallions travelled with their animals to court mares in outlying communities. On one such occasion, YELLOW JACKET, which Jab remembers as a light palomino with flax mane and tail, made the trip to Lincoln County. The Faulkner mare did not settle to that service. At another time, the black Saddlebred stallion GIOVANNI, then an old horse, visited the Mulberry area. Both the Faulkners and Urban Small, future trainer of World Grand Champion City Girl, bred four mares to him in one afternoon. From this mating came Nancy Giovanni, out of a Bright daughter. Nancy Giovanni figured in the pedigrees of both the plantation stock that Jab Faulkner continued to raise, and in that of the 1970 World Grand Champion Ace's Sensation, who was out of her grand-daughter Nancy Wilson.


As Jab Faulkner began his own farming operation with his wife Frances, he had daughters of the stock his family had raised, and used stallions in the area. One horse he admired was a gray son of Wilson's Allen bred by Henry Davis of Wartrace, the man whose idea for a Bedford County festival led to the Tennessee Walking Horse National Celebration. Henry Davis owned TOP WILSON all his life, but in the horse's later years, loaned him to Jab. Faulkner took the big horse home to his barn. He used the teen-aged stallion not only in service on his mares, but as a riding horse as well. The big gray, standing close to 15.3 hands, wore a size 3 horseshoe.

Jab Faulkner has vivid memories of Top Wilson as a saddle horse. "He had plenty of motion in the front, and set his head up. He carried himself good. He had a good canter. Yeah, he was a showy old horse. I'd ride him up and down the road, over here in the bottom, back up the Duck branch. I don't know how many years it had been since he'd been rode, till I got him. I shod him myself."

Faulkner raised three crops of colts from Top Wilson. The old horse died in the early spring, in the Faulkner barn. History has proven Top Wilson to be a significant influence not only on the Tennessee Walking Horse breed, but on the Missouri Foxtrotter breed as well, through his descendant Zane Gray and that stallion's son Missouri Traveler E.

Following the loss of Top Wilson, Faulkner next managed the beautiful linebred Merry Boy son MARK OF MERRY BOY. When Mark's owner, Aubrey Pitts, sold the stallion, Faulkner's mares again traveled, to the court of ANGEL'S GO BOY, then later to PRIDE'S RAMBLING SON, owned by the late P.O. Harrison. Leon describes Son as a show-bred sire that nevertheless produced 'real usin' pleasure horses'. Eventually, Jab began the dispersal process with his broodmare band. The last foals he raised were sired by Leon's own RED BUD'S RASCAL. Jab's

last mare to be sold, a Rambling Son blue sabino named Angel's Lucy Sue, was sold to Hermann Mueller of Trier, Germany. Her spotted sabino Bud colt went to Hank and Mina Hammonds of Simms, Texas, where he stood at stud for several years before being gelded. Hank and Mina are still the proud owners. The Faulkner legacy continues in the lines of stock scattered over Tennessee, to Texas, to the Midwest in the United States, into Alberta, Canada, and in Germany. The stallions Jab Faulkner so vividly remembers live on in these descendants who continue to provide "happy trails" with their good temperaments, brains, and solid saddle gaits.

CANADIAN REGISTRY NEWS & NOTES

CLRC REQUEST

CANADIAN LIVESTOCK RECORDS CORPORATION would like to have the 2002 foal registration applications sent to them with a note to say that the DNA hair sample has been sent to Maxxam at the same time that the registration was sent in to CLRC. That way they will know to hold the registration until the DNA report comes in from Maxxam.

DNA TESTS

When sending in the hair sample for a foal to have its DNA recorded and be parentage verified, no name should be put on the Maxxam form. Just list the hair sample as being from the 2002 foal by (Sire's name) out of (Dam's name) as the 2002 foals do not have registered names yet.

Maxxam does ALL DNA Tests in batches (all breeds together). If the results are in at the first of the month they are invoiced at the end of the month. All results are electronically sent to CLRC at least once a week. DNA testing is carried out weekly so if your test is in on the Monday, it is tested, and CLRC should have the results in their data base on the next Monday. (Maxxam sends results straight to the CLRC data base)

NEW REGISTRATION FORMS

A new style of registration certificate has been issued by CLRC since mid June of this year. The new forms incorporate another colour of ink (blue) for the horse's name. The print showing all the ancestors is a little larger. The blood type and DNA numbers (if recorded with CLRC) are included in the box at the lower left side with the colour, markings, sex and date of birth.

The major changes come on the back of the certificate where the horse's name is at the top, then a box showing all the changes in ownership, and below that an application for transfer of ownership. Separate transfer forms will no longer be needed – but you will have to be VERY careful not to make a mistake when filling out the transfer form! Below the transfer form is a certificate of service if the horse is a mare that was bred when sold, and below that are the instructions for transfer of ownership

THIS BUSINESS OF HORSES

Crossing the Canada-US Border with Horses by Dr. Anne Dick

There are regulations that control the movement of horses across the Canadian/US border. In order to cross the border horses must have current Health and Coggins certificates.

Coggins Certificate:

This is an official Agriculture and Agri Food Canada document that certifies the horse has been tested for Equine Infectious Anemia and has a negative result. Your veterinarian completes and signs the documentation and takes a blood sample. The sample is tested at a federally approved veterinary laboratory. If the sample is negative, the document is endorsed by an Agriculture and Agri Food Canada veterinarian (Federal vet). Coggins certificates are valid for six months. If the Coggins expires while the horse is in the US it's the owner's responsibility to get another blood sample taken and certificate issued before crossing the border back into Canada.

Health Certificate:

This is another official Agriculture and Agri Food Canada document completed and signed by your vet then endorsed by the Federal vet. The certificate states that the horse is free from contagious disease and that a negative Coggins has been done within six months. Health Certificates are valid for 30 days and if it expires while the horse is in the US it is the owner's responsibility to ensure a new valid certificate is issued before crossing the border back into Canada.

Proof of Ownership:

This can be a bill of sale and/or registration papers that correctly identify the horse being transported (gender, colour, markings, brands, etc).

Usually there are no requirements for a horse temporarily being exported (for pasturage, competition, training, breeding, etc) to undergo a Federal Veterinary inspection at the border. Occasionally temporary sanctions are in place that do require a vet inspection-it's a good idea to check ahead with the border crossing you intend to use.

If a horse is purchased in the US with the intent to permanently import the horse to Canada, current Health and Coggins certificates, a bill of sale, and registration papers (if applicable) are required. There will be GST payable on the full purchase price at the time of importation. Call prior to crossing the border to confirm whether or not the horse must have a vet inspection and if necessary, ensure that a Federal vet will be present when you arrive. Only a few of the border crossings have vets on duty on a regular basis and the hours of inspection do vary.

Border crossing regulations do change periodically so contacting the crossing you intend to use in advance is always a good idea.

CONFUSING AND INTERESTING by Dianne Little

I often receive questions and comments about 'The Canadian' Futurity. It would be dishonest to say that I enjoy all questions equally. They vary from difficult to embarrassing, thought provoking to nobrainers, complimentary to critical, simple to convoluted, technical to emotional, hypothetical or philosophical to concrete, and rational to emotional. No matter what the question, an answer is expected and hopefully appreciated.

The motivation for questions and comments vary, but they have one thing in common – the person cares enough to communicate. I am not certain that my response is what the person wants or that I have addressed the issue to the satisfaction of the questioner, but the questioner deserves to treated with respect and the question answered with thoughtfulness.

I used to think that the most difficult questions were those I received in writing. These people felt strongly enough and were concerned enough to organize their thoughts in a letter. In order to respond, I was forced to analyze the question clearly from all aspects, examine the rules that might be an integral part of the question, understand the motivation for posing the question, evaluate my reaction to the question, eventually arrive at a conclusion or answer, and respond in writing. My written response is followed by my signature and is a pronouncement of what I believe and am willing to defend. It can and should be shown to others and discussed by others. After the fact I cannot affirm that what I wrote was not what I meant.

A written response is good for me, good for the questioner, and good for 'The Canadian'. What is clearly stated can be the basis for further discussion. There is time for both parties to digest what is said and offer further thoughtful comments on the content.

THE FOLLOWING IS IN RESPONSE TO A LETTER I RECEIVED A FEW YEARS AGO:


I am sorry to hear you were getting quite discouraged that your horses did not seem to be what the judges were looking for. It often seems that the horses that catch an individual judge's eye are not always the type of horses that you were breeding. I however believe that there are other 'judges' at 'The Canadian' and those are the other breeders and spectators. Each person has his or her personal vision of the Tennessee Walking Horse and that personal vision is not always the same as the judge's. No matter how we structure the evaluation process, there is latitude for the personal opinion of the judge. Over the period of five years with the evaluation of five different judges, an individual

breeder should receive a more balanced opinion of their breeding programme.


In reference to your letter and I quote -"one thing that is confusing and at the same time interesting is one judge's opinion that a horse has a nice sloped shoulder and the next stating the shoulder was too straight". I can understand your confusion, but this is not an unusual puzzle. Although there are definitive standards of conformation for horses, each person interprets this standard in a slightly different way. One of the most difficult to interpret is the slope of the shoulder. According to the CEF Rules for Judging the Tennessee Walking Horse, the shoulder should be muscular and well sloping for maximum reach. I might suggest the following reasons for this difference: the horse may not be standing the same way from one year to the next year, or the horse may have had its feet trimmed differently. Although not written in TWH standards (but a standard of general horse knowledge), the angle of the pastern should equal the angle of the shoulder; therefore, if the horse was trimmed so that the pastern angle was more upright, the judge may have assumed the shoulder was more upright. Perhaps the case may be that each judge had a different idea of what constituted a nicely sloped shoulder. In other words, there is not a definitive answer to your confusion.

I thank you for your letter, hope I have responded to your concerns, and look forward to further correspondence. Thank you again for caring enough to communicate.
