

Left Wheel: G2's Ebby's Sir Prize 16:3 hh Right Wheel: Ebby's Silver Coal 17 hh




# HISTORY & HERITAGE PROJECT

"CANADIAN TIMES OF THE TWH"



The Walking Horse News has been running this History & Heritage Project page for over ten years now. At first, you, the readers, sent in photos and pedigrees of your Walking Horses and Dianne Little collected and compiled them. We ended up with over one thousand to mark the turn of the century and the beginning of a new chapter in the history of Walking Horses in Canada. They are now preserved in the History & Heritage CD's, still available from CRTWH.

The first person to send in photos for this record was Jo-Anne McDonald of Pouce Coupe, BC. She sent a package of about 60, including pictures of well known sires and dams such as Beauty's Sage King and Little Toot Wilson, Walkers you might very well find if you look back in your own horse's pedigree. See Sage King above, and Toots below, with Sage King's Gypsy Bay. Both were originally imported from Pearl Tompkins' ranch in Montana.



Recently the CRTWH Board arranged to have all the pedigrees of Canadian registered horses available on the CLRC website. So now the complete record is there for you to consult. But only the "Pix and Peds" CD will give you photos of the horses!

I have been printing your Canadian Times stories about your involvement with TWH on this page for just as long. Now it's time to ask if you want to continue this feature.

When we began, I printed a list of questions to help people get started on their stories. Here are those questions again, and I will look forward to your responses. Let's hear from you!

- How long have you owned Walkers?

- 10. Here's an additional question. If you are searching for a TWH saddle prospect, what do you look for in terms of gait, conformation, disposition?


These questions are only suggestions to help you get started on your story. I know there are many, many fascinating tales of Tennessee Walkers out there. Put them in writing!





# **FOSH Unveils Database of Horse Protection Act Violators**

January 4, 2010

Friends of Sound Horses (FOSH) announced the unveiling of a web site listing over 8,700 Horse Protection Act violators who have received suspensions from 1986 to the present. The Horse Protection Act (HPA) is the Federal law that makes it illegal to "sore" Tennessee Walking Horses and other gaited breeds Soring is the abusive practice of creating pain with chemical or mechanical means on the front legs and hooves to exaggerate and create an artificial gait for the show ring.

Access to these records is critical to protect horses. Individuals selecting a professional trainer for their gaited horse can research the trainer's violation history. A buyer can verify the seller's reputation for soring. Horse rescues that are placing horses with new adoptees can verify their HPA history before placing the horse. Show management and enforcement officials can familiarize themselves with names of repeat violators, which are listed in one of the search options. The site also provides current data, such as suspension proportions by state, and by violation type.

FOSH is providing the information as a resource for persons who are active, or wish to become active, in owning, breeding and/or showing Tennessee Walking Horses, Racking Horses and Spotted Saddle Horses, the principal breeds subject to regulation under the Horse Protection Act. Users have free access to the information after registering at www.hpadata.us.

Sources of the data include the official disqualification and civil penalty lists maintained by the Animal and Plant Health Inspection Service of the U.S. Department of Agriculture (USDA); violation and penalty information reported by USDA-certified Horse Industry Organizations (HIOs) such as SHOW, the National Horse Show Commission (NHSC) and other HIOs that have participated in the USDA-sponsored Operating Plans, and various public web sites. Any corrections must be directed to the original source HIO which reported the data. There are 13 USDA-certified HIOs at present.

This listing does not include all HPA offenders because the USDA is restricted by budget and only attends about 7 % of the shows. Many industry inspectors have proven to be lax in their examinations when the USDA is not present to provide oversight.

Early records were disorganized and lacking; however, the FOSH database is the most complete listing available today of Horse Protection Act violators.

FOSH is the national leader in the promotion of natural, sound gaited horses and in the fight against abuse and soring of Tennessee Walking Horses and all gaited horses. For more information about FOSH, or to become a member, please visit www.fosh.info or call 800-651-7993.

#### **REGION #7 DIRECTOR**



#### **HOW SLOW IS FAST?**

#### **Evaluating the Speed of Gaited Horses**

"If the horse has speed at his running walk, and can stay in form, that is well and good; but let us not rack him and call it a running walk. His flat walk should be a distinctive FLAT walk, not a slow running walk." *John W. Taylor*, Eagleville, Tennessee, one of three judges of the 1944 and 1948 TWH National Celebration shows. The 1944 WGC was *Oakwood's City Girl*. The 1948 WGC was *Merry Go Boy*.

"His running walk should be without any trace or degree of rack, pace, or stepping pace. Speed at the running walk is desirable, but form should never be sacrificed for excessive speed. The flat-foot walk should be bold, square and straight, above all, it should stay flat and loose - like a horse going after the cows." TWH judge O.R. Matthews, Reelsville, Indiana

"The running walk should be the same form as the flat-foot walk, but with more speed, (yet never sacrificing form for speed) rather than a shift to a stepping pace, racking gait or a trot." *J.B. Smith*, Stanleytown, Virginia, one of three judges of the 1948 TWH celebration.

"The flat-foot walk should be identical to the running walk; but at a speed of about 3 to 4 miles per hour, square from all four corners" *Jack Slayden*, one of three judges for the 1941 Celebration where *Haynes' Peacock* was awarded the World's Grand Championship.

"There is no swing in a flat-foot walk. The running walk should be as near the flat-foot walk as possible, just a bit extended perhaps, and about four miles per hour faster. Most of our horses are over-ridden, not under-ridden. Many times we may be fooled by our eyes." TWH Judge Hemy S. Alexander, Clinton, Kentucky.

The above quotes can be found in the book *Biography of the Tennessee Walking Horse*, by Ben A. Green, published in 1960. Today the TWHBEA, Canadian Registry of the TWH, Friends of Sound Horses, and National Walking Horse Association all have official statements that correct form at the running walk should never be sacrificed for speed. However, the speed range given for flat walk and

running walk differs greatly among these organizations. Based on the speeds given by the judges quoted above, a 3 mile per hour flat-foot walk plus 4 miles per hour equals a 7 mile per hour running walk. A 4 mph flat-foot walk plus 4 mph equals an 8 mph running walk.

#### **DECODING THE CLICHÉ**

While everyone agrees in theory that 'Form should never be sacrificed for speed', the phrase has become a cliché. What does it mean?

In this context the word *form* means: The essence of something.

Essence is: The intrinsic or indispensable properties that characterize or identify something.

Form is what the horse is doing - the sequence, timing, weight support and weight transfer that define each gait.

Let's re-phrase the cliché. Speed is desirable only if it does not change or corrupt the running walk.

Speed is defined as how fast something moves. Speed is measured by elapsed time over a known distance. Speed is a comparison of how fast or how slow something is. Speed never defines or describes what is happening to attain the speed. Speed does not and cannot define a gait.

#### SPEED INFLUENCES GAIT

It is true that the speed a horse is traveling influences which gait the horse does. Each gait has physical and physiological parameters that determine the speed range of the gait. These parameters are biological absolutes that cannot be changed.

The speed range of a particular gait for a particular horse may be slower than the absolute limits for horses as a species; it will never be faster than those absolute limits.

When the horse moves at a speed faster or slower than the physical limits of one gait the horse must change something about the weight support, weight transfer, timing, or sequence it is using. A change in any one of these is a change of gait. Remember, it is impossible for horses to violate the laws of physics and their own physiology.


Recognizing the existence of absolute physical limits on gaits is essential for understanding why some forms of movement are more functional or more desirable than others. Understanding these physical limits reveals when and why horses change gait. Knowing the physical limits of each gait is essential for establishing safe, sound, realistic performance expectations.

Truly humane horse training cannot and will not happen until and unless the trainer respects the unchangeable parameters of all of the gaits inherited by the individual horse. Attempting to compel horses to defy the natural limits of their own gaits is abuse.

# What Can You Do with Your Horse?



Let's see how mannerly and safe your horse really is.

How much time have you spent with it?

What have you taught it?

# Can you...

Catch the horse in a Stall, Paddock or Field?

Halter it?

Lead the horse Beside you, Behind you and From the Off Side?

Tie up the Horse (who will stand for at least 2 minutes) and move in both directions when asked?

**Groom** the horse, touching its head and body everywhere including ears, under tail and udder or sheath? Lift all feet while horse is either tied or free standing?

Lead the horse Through an open gate, Through a closed gate that you open and close behind you and the horse? Up a slope, Down a slope, Through mud, Around mud and Through & around water? Can you lead the horse Around distractions, machinery, vehicles or bicycles and Noise distraction of some type? Around other animals (other horses, cattle, sheep, pigs, goats, cats, dogs, ducks, chickens, etc.)? Through an obstacle course? Over and around a safe piece of plywood or tarp? Over poles or logs with uneven spacing? Will your horse move 6 steps over to the left (with light or no side pressure)? Move 6 steps over to the right (side pressure)? Back a minimum of 6 steps?

If You Had to Doctor your horse, could you Hose its legs? Show its Teeth? Give it a tube of medicine?

Can You Dress Your Horse? Blanket it (not necessarily a horse blanket)? Put on Leg protection of some kind (eg: Polo wraps, shipping boots, splint boots, bell boots)? A Fly mask? Ask the horse to move in these?

How about Loading in a Trailer? Does the horse go in safely & readily? Come off safely and in control?

Even if you have no interest in entering the Training Levels Challenge with your horse, this basic safe handling list would be of value to ANY horse owner who wants a horse that is a pleasure to have around. Working with your horse to accomplish these tasks helps build a bond between you, and if you plan to ride the horse – well, it's *good* to have a working relationship! And think of the value of a video showing the horse demonstrating what it knows if you should want to sell it! Just for fun, go out there with your horse and try these. See just what it knows – and what you still need to teach it.

And if the pair of you can do it all - find someone to make a video of you doing it!

To try for the CRTWH Training Level Challenge - BASIC SKILLS Award, a horse must be over 18 months. Basic Skills demonstrates that the horse has been handled from both sides, and is respectful of the handler and is respectful of the handler's space. Any practice deemed unsafe or dangerous, or abusive for either horse or handler/rider, will result in disqualification. A horse that does not respect the handler's space will be disqualified. To continue on in driving or under saddle in the TLC program, all horses must first attain the Basic Skills Level.

In all tasks, perfection is not the goal. Safety for both horse and handler, respect and willingness, are what is being judged. It is expected that some new circumstances may cause a horse to stop or refuse. It is not the stopping that matters, but how the situation is handled by horse or handler.

It is not expected that the horse should not react normally in some situations, but the horse should also calm down and work through the situation.





# From The Dusty Files of WHN

# January, 1980-30 Years Ago

The Jan/Feb 1980 issue consisted of six pages printed on one side with the Spirit Master mimeograph machine at school. Subscriptions were \$3.00, and the folded, hand addressed sheets were mailed six times a year.

We had news of a clinic and show being planned for early July in the Peace River area. Edmonton Northlands had turned a cold shoulder to TWH classes, Judy Cameron reported. And there was a notice of meeting to form a Central Alberta TWH Association - the Yellowhead Walking Horse Association - on February 9/80.

Marie Hubbard sent news that local horse shoer, Peter Addie, was going to work with Joe Webb, Searcy, Arkansas for several weeks to learn corrective shoeing of Walkers, and Rocking Walkers Stud Farm of Innisfree was asking for advice on standing a stallion to the public.

The Dolls of Douglas, MB announced the purchase of Go Boy's Crown Royal (by Merry Go Boy x a Midnight Sun daughter). This big 12 year old black had been the 1968 World Champion weanling. They ran an ad for their new stallion in WHN. (Jo-Anne McDonald's photo of Go Boy's Crown Royal in his 20's - right.)



# January/February 1990 - 20 Years Ago

By January/February 1990, Walking Horse News had grown tremendously – it was 40 pages in all! Jo Kingsland had joined with me as Assistant Editor, as well as to do the photo ads and production. Subscost \$10 / year, it was still mailed six times a year, and for the J/F issue we had a glossy green cover with a black & white photo in the middle of a maple leaf. The subject of the photo that month was Russ Davies and his white Walking Pony pulling a (smaller) round bale out to feed.

Some articles were The Great Montana Cattle Drive of '89 by Leonard Eliason, a good-bye tribute to Laddie's Monte Ray by Jo-Anne McDonald; lots of discussion and opinions on 'speed' of the running walk and the value (or not) of two registries. Jo Kingsland wrote an article on bits and Joyce Patterson shared her riding log with us. She had kept a record of her riding over the year to Dec. 31,1989 and said, "So all in all, Robin and I did approximately 827 miles since March 8."



They were Go Shadow Go and Shaker's Royal Heir by Helen Williamson of Westridge Farms, Calgary; Dee Jay's Bee Bopper at Matechuks' D-Joint Ranch, Cochrane, AB; Dressed For Success at McDonald Farms, Pouce Coupe, BC; and Northfork Sky Walker by Jean Rempel, Rocky Slopes Farm, Winfield, AB. On the inside front cover were Midnight Toddy at Snowbird Stables, Strathmore, AB, and Beauty's Trail's End at Mona McMillan/Jerry Harlton's Mainwynd Stables, Spruce Grove, AB.

# January/February 2000 - 10 Years Ago

With the January/February issue, Walking Horse News had entered a new era of professionally printed, all colour covers on the front and back of the magazine. The cover photo showed Brenda Bettles of Armstrong, BC leading her mare, Shaker's Silene through a tricky, balloon strewn, trail obstacles course. On the back was a full page ad for The Aristocrat A.G., owned by Alice Green and managed by Rick Hemmett, Calgary, AB. The inside front and back were still in black and white. The inside front cover had a full page ad for Laurindale Stables' Coin's Double Play and D.P.'s Big Shiney Tunes. The inside back cover featured Shirley Wesslen & Harry Hallet's Legacy Walkers with T-Bone's Diamond Edition; Oberle's Skyline at Horse Creek with Generator's Diamond; McDonald Farms' Canadian Shaker (by Go Boy's Crown Royal, above); and R. Diamond Picasso standing at Rough Diamond Farm, Rose Prairie, BC.

There were stories from Eldon Eadie, Anita Duncan, Lori Dyberg, and Barb Fenwick. Franne Brandon had the second in her series "From the Hills of Franklin County", featuring Jimmie and Emma Gray & their famous line of 'Gray' horses, starting with the mare, Maude Gray.
