



"Gypsy" was bred by M.D. McCurdy, Missouri, and came to Canada in utero. We (Marjorie & Charles Lacy) bought her dam, King's Taylor Maid, from Quentin Bybee of Missouri one fall after he'd been up in Saskatchewan training dogs. After we'd purchased "Pete", Quentin mentioned that she might be in foal, as he had kept her with another horse he'd bought at an auction and brought up with him, the stallion, Bay Bally Hoo. That made for a lot of letter writing and phoning to the States, since we needed the signature of the owner of the stallion at time of breeding so that the possible resulting foal could be registered. The previous owner of Bay Bally Hoo turned out to be the president of the TWHBEA at that time, Donald Franks, and luckily for us and for Gypsy, he agreed to sign the papers.

We sold Gypsy as a four year old to Joan Arychuk, who sold


her to Val. They hit it off together and there she has stayed ever since.

She and Val were very successful in the show rings in the '80s.

VAL LORINCZY, LEDUC, writes, "Just thought I would mention that Gypsy (Uphill Gypsy Bay) is 20 years old now. She is still my favorite trustworthy mare and has a lot of character. Almost lost her to an infection of sorts (high fever, dehydration) last fall. We did pull her through and she held on to her foal until nine and half months. She then aborted a lovely bay filly just like herself. Very sad day. But at least she is okay. There will never be as good a horse as her. Wish we could have a "Geriatric Horse Show" and let her strut her stuff. Wonder how all the "elders" would do?"

THE HORSE OF MY DREAMS

Calling to mind my experiences of involvement with horses down through the years bring recollections of memories both positive and negative. Reliving these memories from time to time can be a source of knowledge to help us achieve new ideas and reach goals in training and working our horses that will enrich the life of both the horse and the horse-loving person. It's

not the worst thing in the world to make a mistake, but if you haven't learned anything from them, your mistakes and wrong decisions will definitely multiply.

Both Mabel and I are horse loving people. We love our Tennessee Walking Horses for who they are and what they represent from the equine breeds of the world. Mabel's

recreational outlet in later years of her life became horseback riding, thanks to a gentle Standardbred mare named "Lady". With Lady she gained the confidence required to become a good trail rider.

It is of the utmost importance to have a horse with the right temperament to suit the need of the rider. A quiet gentle horse builds confidence, which is most essential if you are to enjoy horseback riding without being timid or fearful. First time bad experiences have a way of lingering in the mind and can take a long time to overcome.

My introduction to bareback horse riding came when I was six years old. We were not blessed with a fine riding horse of that era. One of the young work horses, weighing in at about 1250 pounds, was chosen to be the school horse. Babe featured a Roman nose, a bald white

face and white stockings up to the hocks. Her disproportionate conformation would not have won her a ribbon at a horse show. The four mile route to school was lined with Russian thistles. When they dried out and were propelled by the wind they were a scary object to most any horse.

On my way to school one October morning a big ball of thistle rolled out in front of Babe. She side-passed quicker than a jumping jack popping out of his box. The school boy, his lunch bucket and satchel made quite a display sprawled out in those Russian thistles.

Babe turned 180 degrees and was homeward bound. About twenty minutes passed. Hoof beats were heard coming up the road. It was Dad, riding Babe at a good clip. His only words of sympathy were, "Let me lift you back up. Hurry, you're late for school, and see to it that you don't fall off again."

A s a youngster I wasn't real

proud of my horse. When put alongside some of the other students' handsome blood horses, Babe managed only a couple of hundred yards while they could finish a half mile flat race. It became my dream to to own a beautiful black one day, a horse that could outrun all the other horses. A lot of water has passed under the bridge prior to that dream being realized.


In later years Mabel and I spent many pleasant hours trail riding our horses in Kananaskis Country and the Ya Ha Tinda. We loved our Arabs - they were faithful, well behaved, and ready to carry us wherever our hearts desired to go. But that image of a black horse was always in the back of my mind: a handsome horse, well balanced, nicely chiseled head, at least 15:2 hands, with an aristocratic look...

One day I was riding with a friend and he kept

up a steady chatter about those "incredible" Tennessee Walking Horses. Curiosity got the better of me. Scouting around, asking questions, I stumbled onto a beautiful four year old dark chestnut filly that was for sale. Thus it was in February of 1993 that we acquired our first Tennessee Walker, named "Veda". The ride was totally different from our other horses. As soon as Mabel saw Veda she said, "I would love to have her". So the search was on for a second Walker.

We bought a three year old roan sabino filly. She learned quickly and became a faithful friend who never hesitated to take me wherever I wanted to go. We made literally hundreds of kilometers in K-Country. Every ride was an experience in itself. But as great a horse as Classy was, I still dreamed of that handsome black...

So, in June of 1995. Mabel's mare was serviced by a good-looking black stallion named Midnight Toddy. About eleven months later, I had my black "Toddy's Flashing colt, Cappuccino". He was started under saddle as a two year old and exhibited many of the qualities that make up the Tennessee Walking Horse. However, all was not positive - there is a negative side. Flash is easily frightened. When adrenalin courses through his bloodstream, his one thought is "Shy or Run away!".

A steady hand and a comforting voice are gradually finding their way into his mind, and he is beginning to face his fears. On a bush or mountain trail it's the unusual rock, cattle, cyclists, or brightly dressed hikers who are the objects of his fear. Learning to read the horse's ears, the suddenly raised head, the tightening of the muscles, all are beneficial communicators to the rider. They will tell you what your horse is seeing, smelling or hearing, long before you are aware of something frightening or spooky on the trail. It is the rider's responsibility to size up the situation and help your horse face its fear.

It was in early October of 1999. A friend, Paul Jordan, and I were riding the cutlines west of Sundre when a herd of wild horses came into view. Most of them were pintos. Flash's ears shot forward, his body tensed, and I knew we were in for a 180 degree turn and the hundred yards dash! He was wired higher than a kite. The return to the trail head that should have taken us an hour and thirty minutes was covered in exactly one hour flat.

Many hours of trail riding is making a difference. Flash is learning. His fears are beginning to change to curiousity and we have enjoyed many hours of pleasurable riding on the trails. Rivers, waterfalls, bridges, boggy places have not posed any great problem. Flash takes them in stride.

The Tennessee Walker makes an exceptional trail horse. The bush and mountain trails with all the

> varied changes in scenery and terrain are a valuable means of discipline. Not only does your equine buddy benefit, but so does the rider. The relaxation, peace and quiet are a tonic for the mind, soul and body. It makes you wish you could build yourself a log cabin in some lush valley beside a flowing stream.

> With another season of trail riding, I'll be able to say that at last I have that "incredible" black horse I pictured in my mind so many years ago.

"Lisa and Daren Felner also rode TWH in the race. Both were riding broodmares who both completed the course successfully."




"Must also make mention of the new cover design of the WHN. Very nice - the colour is wonderful. The magazine gets better every time."









FROM FOUNDATIONS TO THE FUTURE

COLOR CRAZE Part II - Glimmers of Gold

Gleaming golden coats with flowing white manes and tails have always been popular among Tennessee Walking Horse fanciers, with descendants of its most famous representative, TRIGGER, JR. (ALLEN'S GOLD ZEPHYR 431975), still alive and well in both the U.S. and Canada. It has only been within the past five years, however, that continuing research into the genetics of

horse coat color revealed that not one, but two genes for what has been called "palomino", exist within the Tennessee Walking Horse breed.

Unlike the genes causing graying, roaning, and spotting, which superimpose upon the base coat, the genes for gold blend with the base coat color to create something distinctively different from the original. Known and studied the longest is the "cremello" or cream gene. The cream gene blends with a basic red coat to create a golden body color. Flax or red manes and tails become blond, silver, or snowy white. If the base coat color is a light golden red, the resulting animal may be a very pale gold with a true white mane and tail. While the classic golden versions have been called palomino for years, this "pastel

palomino" is termed an isabella. Interaction of the cremello gene with black color produces no results; consequently, when a bay horse also acquires the cremello gene, it becomes a buckskin. The cream gene, of course, has little or no visible effect on a black horse, but if one of these blacks carrying a (hidden) cream gene passes it on to a chestnut mate, the resulting foal will be a (surprise!) palomino. This is one of the few times when a dominant gene is masked by another, to become evident only in the offspring. The homozygous horse that carries two cream genes is called a cremello if the base coat is red, and perlino if the base coat is bay. (Cremellos


look white, have pink skin, and blue eyes throughout their lives. Perlinos look much the same but have grayish manes and tails.) A cremello or perlino is one of Mother Nature's few guarantees, always supplying palominos if the other parent is chestnut or sorrel. As with any other homozygous gene, the breeder may have to choose between the color guarantee, or desired pedigree; never,

of course, sacrificing quality for color!

The most recent addition to the nomenclature of Tennessee Walking gold is champagne. The champagne gene is a dilution gene found in other breeds, but due to the prevalence of blacks in the walker breed, its total effects are more in evidence within walker ranks. The champagne gene has an impact not only on coat color but on skin and eyes as well. Champagne foals arrive with dark coats in unusual shades, pink skin and blue eyes. The eyes eventually darken to amber, the skin acquires a mottling known as "pumpkin spots", and the foal coat sheds out to lighter shades. Dr. Philip Sponenberg, coat color genetics expert at Virginia Tech, writes, "This is an interesting gene as it appears to vary considerably in its

level of activity. Some chestnuts with the gene would never be considered "gold" but are a rather orangey color, for example."

In spite of these variations in the level of activity, three names have been designated for the gene's action on the basic coat colors. The gold champagnes have golden coats and white or self-gold manes and tails, and are often confused with palominos (and continue to be incorrectly registered as such). The amber champagnes resemble buckskins but in many cases the points are chocolate rather than black. The classic champagnes have been described as Weimaraner tan,

but if the gene interacts with a true black coat, the effect appears nothing short of fantastic to the first time viewer. The irridescence remains, yet the horse is not tan, but a remarkable shade close to that of pink champagne.

Documented champagnes are still so rare within the walking horse gene pool that, as of today, no homozygous champagne has been discovered. All champagne stallions available for public service are heterozygous for the gene. The advantage of the

champagne gene over the cremello is that it affects the dark brown and black coats as well as the chestnut. A single champagne gene also dilutes skin and eye color which a single cremello gene does not. The preference of dark skin and eyes, or lighter skin and eyes, is a matter of

personal taste.

Because the founders of the association to register Tennessee's native saddle horse did not place any restrictions on the colors or markings of the horses whose pedigrees it recorded, as did some other breed registries, today's breeders and owners have the choice of a full range of equine colors and patterns. When breeding for color as well as quality, it helps to know the basic genetic principles about color and pattern dominance. For the sharpest color results, it's generally best not to mix patterns, or to add patterns to a dilution gene. Finally, as anyone knows who has dreamed of the perfectly colored horse for years, a measure of luck, even with the homozygous genes, helps quite a bit. My old palomino mare had only four golden babies out of eleven foals, and two of those died in their first critical week. I hope her golden daughter will be kinder to us!



ROY ROGERS & GENE AUTRY AND THEIR TENNESSEE WALKERS

Roy Rogers' original "Trigger" was a magnificent golden palomino purchased from Hollywood Studios in 1938. He bought "Trigger Jr." in 1948. This horse, ALLEN'S GOLD ZEPHYR, TWHBEA # 431975, came from Paul K. Fisher's farm in Souderton, Pennsylvania. During the 1940s and 1950s, Paul was known for having the largest breeding farm in the U.S. for both palomino Tennessee Walking Horses and palomino Quarter Horses. His horses were in great demand, and among his prized stock was Allen's Gold Zephyr. He had beautiful conformation and a very stylish way of going. Zephyr was highly schooled and could accomplish a variety of difficult tricks.

Calvin Miller, now deceased, of Rhame, North Dakota, bought a son of Allen's Gold Zephyr, ZEPHYR'S FLASH O'GOLD. This horse sired many Tennessee Walking Horse offspring while Calvin had him. In 1960 my mother, Marie McBroom, traded two registered TWH fillies to Calvin for the stallion. My mother continued to use Flash O'Gold as a sire in western Montana and Washington and descendents of this stallion can be found throughout the Northwest and in Canada today.


One of the fillies that my mother traded to Calvin, COL'S PRINCESS PAT, became the dam of one of Gene Autry's "Champions". Calvin sold her son, RED CLOUD V,

to Dr. Owen Vowell of El Paso, Texas on July 30, 1965. Dr. Vowell later sold him to Gene Autry. Red Cloud was a chestnut with four stockings and a blaze, the trademark color chosen by Gene Autry for his "Champions".

The very first, original Champion that Gene Autry used in movies beginning in 1934 until after World War II was a half Morgan / half Quarter Horse with three stockings and a blaze. According to Jay Berry, horse manager and trainer for Gene Autry from 1939 until 1962, this first "Champion" (also known as Tony) was probably purchased from horse trainer John Agee, who worked with Tom Mix and for Gene Autrey.

The next "Champion", registered Tennessee Walking Horse named STONEWALL ALLEN, TWHBEA #360159, was purchased in about 1937 as a three year old from Grainger Williams of Antioch, Tennessee, who owned a loose-leaf notebook company. Stonewall Allen, a chestnut with four stockings and a blaze, was trained by John Agee. Stonewall Allen became the famous "Champion" that performed over twenty tricks at liberty on stage while on tour with Gene Autry and Jay Berry. Mr. Berry travelled over 8000 miles with Stonewall Allen while on tour to eleven major cities in the U.S. and to England and Cuba.

Stonewall Allen was never in any movies; he was only seen in personal appearances and photographs. Gene Autry did not want to chance his being injured

filming movies. His beauty and gentle, dependable disposition made him a real crowd pleaser, performing live on stage before an audience.

Stonewall Allen "Champion" often performed tricks with a small, perfect little horse called "Little Champ". He was a Spanish Galiceno found in Nuys, California and purchased from Fess Reynolds, a clown, as recalled by Jay Berry. "Little Champ" looked like "Champion" with his chestnut color, four stockings and blaze.

There were several "Champion Jrs." featured in movies, but no Tennessee Walkers. Most carried Morgan, Quarter Horse or some Arabian blood. For example, the horse starring in the movie, "The Strawberry Roan", was a half Arabian called "Boots".



Stonewall Allen died in his late twenties and was buried at the Gene Autrey Melody Ranch by Jay Berry. The last "Champion Jr." at Melody Ranch, a half Morgan / half Quarter Horse, passed away in 1990, estimated at over 40 years old.

CANADIAN REGISTRY OF THE TENNESSEE WALKING HORSE

At the Annual General Meeting in April of 1999, the general membership of the CRTWH approved the following changes regarding registration. These changes were approved by the Federal Department of Agriculture earlier this year.

ARTICLE XVIII REGISTRATION, SECTION A, NUMBERS 6-9

- As of January 1, 2000 in order for a foal to be registered, the sire must have either DNA Hair Analysis Profiling or Blood Typing information on file with the Association.
- 7. As of January 1, 2001 in order for a foal to be registered, the dam must have either DNA Hair Analysis Profiling or Blood Typing information on file with the Association.
- 8. As of January 1, 2002 all foals to be registered with the Association must be parent verified using either DNA Hair Analysis Profiling or Blood Typing before registration will be accepted.
- 9. The Association does not require verification of parentage for an animal already registered with the Canadian Registry of the Tennessee Walking Horse, or the Tennessee Walking Horse Breeder's and Exhibitors Association, or Walking Horse Owners Association.

HOW DO THESE CHANGES AFFECT YOU?

JANUARY 1, 2000

Before you register a foal you must ensure that the stallion owner has supplied CLRC with a record of EITHER the DNA Hair Analysis or Blood Typing of the SIRE. The Stallion does not have to be registered with CRTWH, although he must be a registered Tennessee Walking Horse

JANUARY 1, 2001

Before you register a foal you must ensure that the mare owner has supplied CLRC with a record of EITHER the DNA Hair Analysis or Blood Typing of the DAM. The Mare does not have to be registered with CRTWH, although she must be a registered Tennessee Walking Horse

JANUARY 1, 2002

Before you register a foal you must have EITHER a DNA Hair Analysis Profile or Blood Typing test done for the foal. The foal must then be parent verified using EITHER the DNA Hair Analysis Profiling or Blood Typing. Before parentage can be verified you must ensure that BOTH the stallion and mare owner have supplied CLRC with a record of either the DNA Hair Analysis Profiling or Blood Typing.

Owners choose whether to use DNA Hair Analysis Profiling or Blood Typing. It is not necessary that sire or dam be registered with CRTWH for the foal to be registered with CRTWH; however, CLRC must be supplied with a record of either DNA Hair Analysis Profiling or Blood Typing.

DNA HAIR ANALYSIS PROFILING AND BLOOD TYPING ARE NOT COMPATIBLE Sire, Dam, and Foal must all use DNA Hair Analysis Profiling to Parent Verify

Sire, Dam, and Foal must all use Blood Typing to Parent Verify

This is the time of year that foal owners are scrambling to register their youngsters - but what colour IS it? Those changeable baby coats are giving way to strange mottlings and shades, and even a photograph doesn't seem to catch the right colour.

Here are a few hints that may help:

Any rusty coloured foal with obvious black in mane and tail, and some black coming in on the nicks and scrapes on its legs, will be a bay. Bay can come from one bay or buckskin parent or a black x chestnut mating.

A reddish coloured foal with a mane and tail about the same or lighter, will be some shade of chestnut/sorrel, and can come from nearly any combination of colours! (It's recessive so can hide.)

A greyish/mousy brown to black usually turns out black. One parent must be black or bay.

A palomino is usually born very light and darkens to palomino over a year or more. Don't get excited about having a palomino unless one of the parents IS one.


Qâvâh Teaching: Confidence, Consistency, Compassion, Connection Buckskins are born tan too, but the black mane & tail give them away. Again, don't expect a buckskin unless one parent is buckskin or palomino and the other parent carries the gene for black colour.

You will know you have a champagne if the foal was born with pink skin and unmistakeable bright blue eyes. One parent must be a champagne to get a champagne foal. The only other colour at all like this is cremello, and it must have two palomino or buckskin parents.

A grey foal may be born nearly any colour but will begin to show white hairs, usually on the eyelids first, then on the face, to give you a hint of its future colour. Again, don't look for grey unless one parent is gray.

There are some exceptions to the above, but that covers the majority of cases. If you have a particular question about a foal's colour, write in and we'll try to help.

TRAINING MYTHUNDERSTANDINGS



PRESSURE AND BODY LANGUAGE by Ron Meredith

Heeding uses methodically applied, horse-logical pressures to enable the

horse to feel the shape we want him to take. That is so important that you should go back and read it again.

The pressures must be methodical and consistent. The pressures the horse feels as a particular shape when we first start working with him on the ground must feel the same when we first get into the saddle. They should still feel the same when he gets to advanced work in whatever game we're going to play with him later on. As he advances, he's going to learn new shapes of meaning from those pressures. But the basic meaning never changes.

The pressures must be horse logical. Our goal is to build calmness and trust between ourself and our horse. If the pressures we use to help him understand the shapes we want him to take for the games we want to play are not horse logical, those pressures will make the horse anxious instead of calm, apprehensive instead of trusting.

Let me give you an example. When I first started training in the 1950s, some trainers felt the best way to get a horse's attention was by behaving like a predator and attacking the horse. The trainer wanted that horse to regard him as the biggest, baddest thing in the barn and to show him a sign of proper respect. That sign was that the horse was to turn and face him. So a trainer working with a new stallion might go into the horse's stall and make a lot of commotion with a whip or whatever to get the horse stirred up and running around from corner to corner. The trainer would keep after the horse until the horse turned and faced him. Then he'd back the pressure off.

From the horse's viewpoint, there was nothing horse logical about this pressure at all. From his perspective, he was being attacked by a predator and was looking for some way to escape. The horse had to find the "correct" response the trainer wanted by accidentally doing it the first time. The trainer would "attack" the horse over and over until he finally conditioned the horse to turn and face him whenever he entered the horse's stall.

Getting the horse's attention is the first step in heeding, too. But instead of attacking the horse to get it, we play on his natural instincts to shape a horse logical situation. Some horses are curious enough that when something new enters their space (their stall, their paddock, their pasture), they just naturally turn to take a look at it. If they don't pay attention to us, we might make a very tiny fuss (a small clicking or kissing noise, tapping a hand against a thigh, shaking a lead rope very quietly) to ask them to pay attention. We might move our secondary line just a little relative to theirs to put a little pressure on their "space".

If they still don't turn and give us their attention, we do not make the fussy pressure louder. If a Frenchman does not understand what you just said to him in English, he will not understand it any better if you repeat it again, only louder. The same is true of the horse. So we just keep up the pressure until it becomes annoying enough that the horse decides he's got to stop whatever else he's doing, and have a look at it. Kind of like a fly that's finally annoyed him enough that he swings his tail at it.

If you learn to read the horse's body language, he will always tell you when the pressure has crossed the line from being something that gets his attention to something he feels as predatory.

As long as the horse is working with rhythm and relaxation, he is paying attention to the pressure and is comfortable with it. The first way a horse will break his rhythmic connection with his handler is by holding his breath. So a horse can break his rhythm while he's just standing still as much as when he's on the move. Whenever his muscles tense for some reason other than the work they are doing, the handler has lost relaxation. Signs that the horse is giving you calm attention with rhythm and relaxation include:

- * steady, rhythmic breathing
- * soft chewing
- * relaxed muscles
- * relaxed ears, focused in direction of handler

Any movement that in even the tiniest way mimics the kicking or biting or running away that the horse would do to protect itself from a predator means the handler has crossed the line. The first signs of this can be very subtle - that simple holding of the horse's breath, for example. So just as the horse must pay close attention to the handler, the handler has to pay close

attention to the horse. Signs that the pressure you are putting on the horse has become too loud include:

- * break in breathing
- * raising head
- * pinning ears
- * grinding teeth
- * tensing back muscles
- * tensing neck muscles
- * unweighting a hind foot
- * raising tail
- * swishing tail
- * tightening facial muscles
- * snaking neck
- * extending head while lowering neck
- * shuddering
- * startling
- * moving off quickly

When the horse has any of these reactions to a pressure, that's a "swear pressure". When someone thinks the way to make a horse pay attention to a pressure it just ignored is to repeat it again, only louder, that pressure usually becomes a swear pressure. Maybe the handler didn't have the horse's attention to begin with. So they need to repeat the pressure at the same level until the horse does pay attention to it. Or maybe the pressure was not horse logical. Or maybe it was more than one step away from something the horse already knows.

Heeding uses methodically applied horse logical pressures to create the feel of a shape in the horse's mind. The trainer must break lessons down into their smallest possible components. Each new thing the horse learns should only be one horse-logical step away from something he already knows. The pressures must be applied consistently from moment to moment, day to day, month to month. They should always mean the same thing to the horse. The horse must pay attention to the trainer at all times and the trainer gets that by paying attention to the horse at all times. The goal is to build calmness and trust along with understanding of the shapes we want the horse to take.

Watching good training is boring unless you understand the finer points of communicating with your horse.





Blue Reconsiders

It had been over eight months since the terrorized, "well-broke," Sam's Blue Blaze broke my arm. I had not been on any horse since. July 3 was a gorgeous day and I wanted to ride, even if it was only around the yard. My best horse, Sassy, has been retired for six years due to severe ringbone. She seems to miss our long rides together as much as I do. Sometimes, when conditions are right, I ride Sassy around the yard for a few minutes, just for old times sake. July 3 was one of those times.

There was another purpose for riding Sassy that day. I wanted Blue to see that going slow in a calm, orderly, manner is not a crime. I'd been told that Blue had been on group rides so she had seen other horses being ridden. She had, of course, been ridden herself. Blue has been around my yard several times so the situation presented nothing new to Blue... Or would it?

Blue was standing with Velvet under their carport shelter when I took Sassy out of the corral. I groomed Sassy, then put her bridle and bareback pad on. Koko, Mister, and Blue watched casually because that was the interesting thing going on in the yard. Velvet was more curious than the others because she hadn't seen this before. When I led Sassy over to the trailer so I could use the fender as amounting block Blue came alert and peeked through the fence

under the carport at what was going on. Mounting from the trailer fender was what I'd done with Blue the day of the wreck.

Sassy started to walk off when I climbed on her back, but a light check with the reins reminded her to wait for instructions. Blue was quite observant as Sassy stood calmly, then moved off at a slow flat-foot walk when I told her to. Sassy flat walked calmly, in a clockwise direction, around the outside of the corral. Blue followed along inside the corral watching closely as Sassy and I proceeded the direction Blue had been

traveling when she'd dumped me into the fence eight months earlier. She circled back to the security of her shelter after Sassy had passed the accident site and continued observing from there.

Sassy and I went around my house and rode in the front yard. Just then a couple of the neighbor girls came hurrying over asking if they could groom the horses and pet Velvet. I stopped Sassy, who stood perfectly still while I sat on her talking to the girls. One of the girls ran home to change her foot wear from sandals to shoes. The other girl headed for the corral.

I rode Sassy counterclockwise around the corral, back the way we'd come. Koko pranced up nickering flirtatiously. I stopped Sassy. She knew she was working so she stood calm and silent while Koko made romantic noises. When she didn't respond, he tossed his head and wandered off. Blue had come out to the middle of the corral again and took careful note of Sassy's reaction to Koko.

When I nudged Sassy into her quiet flat walk again Blue suddenly trotted up to the fence. Velvet cantered along beside her. Blue stopped at the fence and stuck her head over the top rail straining to get a better look. Blue was wide eyed. Her ears were pricked forward so hard they trembled as the tips almost touched. She sniffed and sniffed, inhaling deeply, every sense totally and intensely focused on Sassy and me. I stopped Sassy beside Blue, but far enough away from the fence they wouldn't fuss. Sassy stood contented, relaxed, calm and comfortable. Velvet was curious too so she stuck her head up as high as she could to make her

own inspection of Sassy.

After several seconds of intense sniffing Blue was still not satisfied. She stepped sideways one step to the left which put her closer to Sassy's nose and strained over the fence again, still totally focused on Sassy. Blue's ears still trembled with intensity as she sniffed even more deeply, getting her nose as close to Sassy's face, mouth and bit as she could. Sassy stood calm and relaxed, casually submitting to Blue's inspection without asserting her new rank as alpha mare. Velvet had already lost interest, but not Blue. She was obviously searching for something.

Sassy trusts me completely and likes to do things with me, especially riding. She was wearing her favorite aluminum curb bit. She was standing perfectly content on a loose rein. I had been riding with a loose rein, signaling Sassy with neck reining, seat, legs and

voice. There is nothing unusual about any of that so what was Blue looking for? The scent of fear? Signs of pain or distress from Sassy? Or? And why was the scent of Sassy's mouth and bit of such interest to Blue? Could Blue smell a difference between the aluminum of Sassy's mild bit and the sweet iron and steel of the severe chain mouth Wonder Bit she'd been ridden with? Or was Blue expecting to smell something else in Sassy's mouth? If so, what?

Whatever it was Blue was looking for she evidently did not find it in Sassy. I talked soothingly to Blue while she sniffed, telling her riding can be fun. I also told Blue that I want guiet, relaxed, orderly rides from all my horses. Blue's intense inspection of Sassy continued for at least a full minute, then she abruptly turned away and walked very briskly back to her shelter.

Sassy and I resumed our flat walk journey around the perimeter of the corral. The girls met us at the gate. Blue casually observed the rest of the ride, Sassy's unsaddling and the grooming session that followed, but she wasn't really paying attention to that. Blue appeared to be pondering whatever it was she had learned from Sassy.

The next day, July 4, the neighbor girls came over to visit the horses again. For the first time since her arrival Blue walked up to the fence and let the girls pet her! Awhile later Blue observed that I was putting fly masks on the senior horses. When I went into her corral Blue came to me and showed me that the flies wer

e irritating her eyes too. Blue seemed pleased when I gave her a fly mask of her own a couple of days later. Unfortunately, she did not get to wear it for very long. Mister showed Velvet how to take the fly mask off another horse. Thereafter Blue could not keep her fly mask on for more than five minutes before one of the youngsters removed it.

On July 8 Blue stuck her nose into the middle of Velvet's grooming session, making it quite obvious she wanted some of that for herself.

I had arm surgery July 10 and was gone for several days. When I returned Blue was cheerful and much friendlier.

On July 16 Barbara, the family friend who introduced me to Walking Horses 25 years ago, came to visit and had to see my horses, especially Koko and Velvet. Barbara had two friends with her. My parents and sister came over too, so seven of us tramped out to visit my herd. Blue came right up to the fence with Velvet, proudly showing off her filly. Blue not only let everyone pet Velvet, she let the strangers pet her too!

We'll never know what Blue was thinking when she inspected Sassy. But whatever conclusions Blue came to made her more cheerful, more sociable and more trusting of people than she was before the inspection.
